Steve Birdlebough Short Resume

Steve Birdlebough is a retired attorney. Since 2003 he has worked to encourage transit-oriented developments and restore rail service in the San Francisco North Bay. He serves on the Citizens Advisory Committee for the Sonoma County Transportation Authority, and for many years served on the Citizens Oversight Committee for the Sonoma Marin Area Rail Transit District. He also chairs the Sierra Club's statewide Committee on Transportation and Sustainable Communities, and the Sonoma County Transportation & Land Use Coalition.

He served as a deputy district attorney, had a law practice in Shasta County served as a legislative liaison for the State Judicial Council in Sacramento, as Chief Council for the California Assembly Judiciary Committee, and as an advocate for the Friends Committee on Legislation.

The Sacramento Light Rail project attracted Steve's attention in 1976, when he was commuting to do legislative liaison work in the State Capitol. Steve worked with several citizens' groups, including the Modern Transit Society and Friends of Light Rail to help make that system a success. After the trains started running, he became a volunteer docent for the Sacramento State Railroad Museum.

Steve and his wife, Sally and have six children and 12 grandchildren, scattered from Marin County, California to Cape Town, South Africa. They have enjoyed visiting them, and have experienced transit and many transportation systems in Europe, Asia, and Russia.
