- June 2014: Board forms Creative Sonoma by adopting an Arts Action Plan
- 2018-present: Creative Sonoma completes multiple public art projects
- 2019-2021: Creative Sonoma engages in research on best practices in public art
- 2021: Public Art Policy Ad Hoc Committee established
- 2022: Creative Sonoma contracts with consultant Todd W. Bressi
- Fall 2023: Creative Sonoma experiences leadership staffing changes

Plan vs. Policy

- Public Art Plan: a strategic document that outlines the overall vision and direction for public art within a community.
- Public Art Policy: a set of guidelines and rules that operationalize the objectives outlined in the plan.

- How We Do It: Implementation
 - Project Planning
 - Program Administration
 - Funding Options
 - Governance: Roles & Responsibilities

Direction on Funding

Options for Board Consideration:

- Annual appropriations
 - Capital Outlay budget and/or
 - Transient Occupancy Tax
- Project-specific allocations
- In-lieu fees from developers
- Grants
 - Programmatic and/or
 - Public art-specific
