Summary BOS Action on Tree Ordinances

- Staff presented PC recommendation for modernizing tree protections and new Oak Woodland Combining District, continued from 11/28/2023 and 12/12/2023
- Urgency ordinance for 45-day moratorium on limited tree removal and oak woodland conversion
 - Extended on 1/23/2024 until May 31, 2024
- \Box At 3/5/2024 public workshop, Board directed staff to:
 - Incorporate policy options based on stakeholder feedback between 12/12/23 and 3/5/24

Revised Purpose Statement

The intent of this ordinance is to:

- Support essential community and ecosystem benefits of trees by requiring their protection during construction projects, and requiring mitigations for their removal
- Facilitate hazard reduction, forest health, and property maintenance by exempting qualifying activities from permits or mitigations

Applicability

- Original TPO Applies only to discretionary projects
- PC Recommendation Apply to all tree removal, with exemptions
- March 5th hearing Staff presented two options focusing on limited applicability to permits, with potential for recapture language
 - BOS recommended approach like PC recommendation

Housing

- Affordable housing exemption:
 - Compliance with state housing and planning law
 Proposed language mirrored in OAK
- Exempt by-right housing in Urban Service Areas in TPO and OAK

Forestry Activities

 Clarify that the exemption allows landowners to do their own work on their own land, aligning with State law

Stewardship

- Exempt stewardship and ecological restoration projects
- Exempt work done by government agencies
 - Precedent in grading code for similar work
 - Subject to CEQA/NEPA

Bay Trees & Manzanita

Bay trees removed and manzanita not included

Mitigation Planting

- Removed specific irrigation requirement and clarified general requirements for planting survival.
- Would still require irrigation if new development is subject to WELO requirements.

Mitigation Fees

- Retain existing ordinance fees for ministerial tree removal permits
- Retain PC recommendation for appraisal methodology for use permits for large tree removal in TPO and for use permits in OAK
- Staff will pursue a fee study if directed by the Board

Technical Revisions

- Revisions to the Fire Risk Reduction Exemptions
- Revisions to the Agricultural Exemption
- Language clean up:
 - Protected Species List intro
 - Allow PRMD and Dept. of Ag to enforce provisions
 - Including paths in residential maintenance exemption

Post Adoption Implementation

Guidance documents, education material, BMPs for landowners

Recommendation

By separate actions, adopt:

- TPO An Ordinance Updating the County Code Chapter 25 (subdivision code) and Chapter 26 (zoning code) - Tree Protection Ordinance, Riparian Corridor Ordinance and Minor and Major Timberland Conversion Ordinances
- OAK An Ordinance updating the zoning code Valley Oak Habitat Ordinance (Article 67), create the Oak Woodland Combining District, rezoning certain parcels to apply the district
- Find both ordinances (TPO and OAK) exempt from CEQA
