## 6. Department of Health Services Public Health Agreements

Authorize the Director of Health Services, or designee, to execute the first amendment to a revenue agreement with the County of Mendocino, for data system services in support of Advanced Life Support and Basic Life Support providers, extending the initial term of November 14, 2024 through June 30, 2025, to June 30, 2026. The extension will result in an additional \$15,000 to the Department of Health Services for a total of \$20,000 over the term of the agreement.

Authorize the Director of Health Services, or designee, to execute a revenue agreement with the City of Petaluma for the County of Sonoma to perform administration and compliance activities in support of Petaluma's Tobacco Retailer License for the period of July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2028, resulting in \$19,240 in annual revenue to the Department of Health Services for a total of \$57,720 over the term of the agreement.
