AB 481 Overview

- **September 30, 2021:**
 - AB 481 was signed into law as Government Code sections 7070 – 7075
- **Legislative intent:**
 - To increase public transparency by which all California law enforcement agencies fund, acquire, and/or use military equipment, as defined by AB 481.
- **Law Enforcement Agency Requirements:**
 - Present to the Board of Supervisors a Military Equipment Use policy.
 - Provide an annual report to the Board of Supervisors and the public after first year of adoption.
 - *Hold at least one, well-publicized and conveniently located community engagement meeting prior to annual report being presented to the Board of Supervisors. (Done 4/16/2024)*
- **Board of Supervisor Requirements:**
 - Approve a “Military Equipment” policy through the adoption of an ordinance. *(Approved 5/24/22)*
 - Annually renew or modify the policy upon receipt of annual report.



AB 481 Overview (Cont.)

■ **Board of Supervisors Role:**

- Approve a “Military Equipment” policy through the adoption of an ordinance. *(Approved 5/24/2022)*
- Approve the 2023 Annual Report
- Per AB 481 (7071(d)), this approval will be granted if the Board determines the following:
 - The military equipment is necessary because there is not a reasonable alternative that can achieve the same objective of officer and civilian safety.
 - The proposed military equipment use policy will safeguard the public’s welfare, safety, civil rights, and civil liberties.
 - If purchasing the equipment, the equipment is reasonably cost effective compared to available alternatives that can achieve the same objective of officer and civilian safety.
 - Prior military equipment use complied with the military equipment policy that was in effect at the time, or if prior uses did not comply with the accompanying military equipment use policy, corrective action has been taken to remedy nonconforming uses and ensure future compliance.
