**Resolution Of The Board Of Supervisors Of The County Of Sonoma, State Of California,
Proclaiming the Month of March 2025 to be Family Justice Center Month in Sonoma County**

Whereas, there were six domestic violence related homicides in Sonoma County in 2025 alone; and

Whereas, California has the highest rates of both labor and sex trafficking in the US; and

Whereas, Sonoma County Adult Protective Services received over 7,800 allegations of suspected elder abuse in 2024; and

Whereas, in 2025, the Sonoma County Domestic Violence High-Risk Team (DV-HRT) provided intensive case review of 135 survivors determined to be at high-risk of lethality at the hands of their abusive partner; and

Whereas, the intervention of the DV-HRT provided additional oversight of these cases, resulting in a 100% survival rate for victims in cases reviewed by the DV-HRT; and

Whereas, Domestic Violence incidents involving a weapon increased by more than 340% since 2021; with firearm involved DV incidents doubling in the same timeframe; and

Whereas, the purpose of the Family Justice Center Sonoma County is to advocate for the victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, elder abuse, and child abuse in the County of Sonoma, and to actively work toward the prevention of those crimes, while supporting survivors with essential intervention services all in one place; and

Whereas, the Family Justice Center Sonoma County provides a network of collaborative, co-located partners, including advocates, mental health specialists, law enforcement, prosecutors, and other professionals to provide trauma-informed, coordinated, wraparound services for more than 1,800 adult and child family violence survivors each year; and

Whereas, the Family Justice Center Sonoma County seeks to ensure that victims of abuse are able to access all needed services in one location in order to enhance safety and increase offender accountability; and

Whereas, the Board of Supervisors recognizes the ongoing efforts of the District Attorney's Office, Sonoma County Sheriff's Office, Department of Health Services, Human Services Department, Sonoma County Courts, Santa Rosa Police Department, YWCA Sonoma County, Verity, Council on Aging, Legal Aid, Ruthless Kindness, Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner - Sexual Assault Response Team (SANESART), Victims Empowerment Support Team (VEST), Catholic Charities, Family Law Facilitator, Probation Department, and other law enforcement agencies, County departments, and community groups for working together to end the cycle of domestic violence, sexual assault, and elder abuse and improve services for victims.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that the Board of Supervisors, in recognition of Family Justice Center Sonoma County's effort to address interpersonal and family violence within the community, hereby proclaims March 2026 to be Family Justice Center Month in Sonoma County.
