Recognizing The California Native Plant Society's Doran Beach Restoration Project**

**Whereas**, the California Native Plant Society (CNPS) is a leader in the conservation of California's native flora, committed to preserving and protecting our natural heritage through education, restoration, and advocacy; and

**Whereas**, the CNPS has initiated and diligently pursued a vital restoration project at Doran Park for approximately eight years, focusing on the removal of invasive species, including ice plant and European dune grass, which threaten the native ecosystem and biodiversity and destabilize coastal soil; and

**Whereas**, this restoration effort is not only crucial for the protection and revival of native plant species but also plays a significant role in creating and maintaining suitable nesting habitats for the Federally threatened Snowy Plover, thereby supporting the recovery of this endangered species; and

**Whereas**, the CNPS, through its dedicated volunteers, has made substantial progress in the restoration of Doran Park, demonstrating an exemplary model of community engagement and environmental stewardship; and

**Whereas**, the removal of invasive species and the restoration of native habitats contribute to the health and resilience of our local ecosystems, ensuring that future generations can enjoy the natural beauty and ecological richness of Doran Park.
