What experiences have you had that are relevant to child care or related fields (as a parent, provider, community member, etc.)?	My husband and I are both working professionals, and when our baby, Ellis, was born, we were fortunate to piece together child care using our strong familial support system. We traded workdays and coordinated care between us, which—while hectic and

unsustainable—allowed us to keep costs down and maximize Ellis's time with family. However, by the time Ellis reached six months, it became clear that this piecemeal approach was no longer feasible. We began the daunting process of searching for professional care that aligned with our values—and, as first-time parents, we honestly didn't even know where to begin.

Fortunately, we quickly discovered that there are some amazing resources within Sonoma County. We were pleasantly surprised by the outpouring of information and support we received—particularly from organizations like 4Cs. Their guidance made the process less intimidating.

This experience opened my eyes to how complex and overwhelming it can be for families to access appropriate child care—and how vital accessible, family-centered resources are to navigating it. It also sparked my desire to give back by helping ensure that other caregivers receive the same thoughtful support that we did. It reinforced the ongoing need for clear information, strong infrastructure, and comprehensive support for both families and providers.

What would you hope to gain or achieve by becoming a member of the Council?

By becoming a member of the Child Care Planning Council, I hope to contribute to and learn from a community of individuals committed to improving child care access, quality, and equity in Sonoma County. I want to be part of the solution in building systems that support all families—especially those navigating barriers due to income, language, or geography.

Through Council participation, I look forward to gaining a deeper understanding of child care policy, funding structures, and community needs across the county. I am eager to collaborate with other members to help shape practical, sustainable strategies that uplift both families and providers.

I will also contribute to these efforts through my experience in after school, expanded learning opportunities programming, and systems collaboration with the early learning and care professional community.
What experiences have you had that are relevant to child care or related fields (as a parent, provider, community member, etc.)?	I have experience in after school expanded learning programs, specifically in child care for children ages 5-12. I worked directly in child care for seven years, including five years as a site supervisor of an after school program in Santa Rosa serving elementaryage youth. In this role, I managed AmeriCorps members who provided academic support services to students during school hours, as well as hourly classroom lead staff who provided care, academic support, and enrichment activities after school. I served as a vital bridge between the school community, especially between teachers and working families, while ensuring children had a safe and supportive environment after school. Additionally, I organized and hosted family engagement events and collaborated with community partners to enhance program offerings, tailoring activities to meet the needs and interests of the children in our care.

	For the past three years, I have worked with First 5 Sonoma County, supporting our Quality and Equity in Early Learning initiative. In this role, I have engaged with the early learning and care community to understand their needs in professional development, technical assistance, facilities, mini-grants, and administrative support. I co-lead the Quality Counts Sonoma Consortium, where we leverage the expertise of professionals within the ECE system to design professional development opportunities that address the emerging needs of our community. I have designed and implemented various programs that support ELC professionals with professional development and facilities. With ARPA funding, I developed an ECE facility grant program that has supported the improvement, expansion, and construction of both center-based and home-based child care facilities in Santa Rosa, positively impacting the child care community.

By becoming a member of the Council, I hope to deepen my understanding of the needs of children and families while learning from individuals with diverse perspectives. I am eager to explore ways to address the systemic challenges and barriers that families face to secure a safe and enriching learning environment for their children.
