

14,510 deaths (1,727 new)



3.23.2020 8:00 AM

- First case reported in a returning traveler in Snohomish County, WA on **January 21, 2020**
- First case of suspected community transmission reported in Solano County, CA on **February 26, 2020**
- First death reported in King County, WA on **February 29, 2020**

- 1,733 cases
  - 120 travel-related
  - 165 person-to-person
  - 474 community acquired
  - 950 under investigation
- 27 deaths
- Age distribution
  - 0-17 years – 25 cases
  - 18-64 years – 837 cases
  - 65+ years – 442 cases
  - Unknown age – 14 cases

# Sonoma County Cases *3.23.2020 8:00 AM*

  - 1 case in Diamond Princess traveler excluded – non resident
- 5 cases associated with travel (2 Grand Princess, 2 other)
- 6 associated with community transmission
- 3 cases associated with contact to confirmed case
- 15 under investigation


