- C) Approve the Reappointments of Greg Carr, representing District 1, Ayssa Messer, representing District 3, Luana Pinasco and Stu Clark, representing District 4, Darek Trowbridge, representing the Agriculture Industry, Aryam Blanco in primary seat representing Local Enforcement Agency, Samantha Stevens in the alternate seat representing Local Enforcement Agency, Tasha Wright in the primary seat representing the City of Santa Rosa, Jennifer Lyle in the alternate seat representing County of Sonoma Public Infrastructure, Arthur Deicke in the primary seat representing Scientific Representative, Mike Anderson in the seat of Marketing Specialist, Dan Noble in the seat of Non-Profit Recycling Organization, Elizabeth Bortolotto in the primary seat representing Clean Water Organization, Mark Soiland and Kristyn Byrne representing Sonoma County Recycling Association, Diane Ramirez in the primary seat representing the City of Petaluma, Glenn Morelli representing Sonoma Public Infrastructure, and Taryn M. Obaid representing Climate Change Organization for terms beginning December 10, 2024, ending December 10, 2027.
- D) Approve the Appointment of Chloe Ballard in the primary seat representing the Town of Windsor for a term beginning December 10, 2024, ending December 10, 2027.

Executive Summary:

This item seeks the Board's approval of various appointments to the Sonoma County Local Task Force on Integrated Waste Management. The Local Task Force (LTF) was established on March 13, 1990 (Reso No. 90-0437) as mandated by the Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (AB 939) and other related state laws.

Among its roles is the development and updating of the County's Integrated Waste Management Plan. This plan includes a Source Reduction and Recycling Element, a Household Hazardous Waste Element, a Non-Disposal Facility Element, and a Siting Element. Consistent with AB 939, the LTF also serves to advise the Board of Supervisors on other countywide solid waste resource management and recycling issues.

Rule 50 of the Board Rules of Procedures states that the Clerk of the Board shall convene staff to review prospective countywide appointments and make appointment recommendations to the Board. The current item submits recommendations for positions on the Integrated Waste Management Local Task Force (LTF).

Background

The Local Task Force (LTF) was established on March 13, 1990 (Reso No. 90-0437) as mandated by the Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (AB 939) and other related state laws. Among its roles is the development and updating of the County's Integrated Waste Management Plan. This plan includes a Source Reduction and Recycling Element, a Household Hazardous Waste Element, a Non-Disposal Facility Element, and a Siting Element. Consistent with AB 939, the LTF also serves to advise the Board of Supervisors on other countywide solid waste resource management and recycling issues.

The LTF also provides advice to the jurisdictions of Sonoma County on the implementation of the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan, and to provide a forum for the public discussion of solid waste management, waste reduction, and recycling issues. The LTF is comprised of representatives from each city and the County, organizations with technical expertise, and other interested parties, all of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Sonoma County Public Infrastructure Department (SPI) is requesting the approval of initial appointments for new members and reappointments for existing members to the Local Task Force.
