Introduction – Why a Consolidated Hearing

Fees hearing noticed on March 12 and March 19

 Fee hearing takes place in spring so that adjustments can be included in revenue projections for the new year

Fee hearings consolidated for transparency

Introduction – Why a Consolidated Hearing

 Fees may offset costs in areas where a specific service is received, or a specific benefit granted that does not go to the general public


- Revenue Management Board Policy was ratified on 6/16/2023
 - "...if permissible by law, fees and charges should cover all costs of the services provided, unless otherwise directed by the Board of Supervisors, to provide for the public benefit"

Summary of changes – Levels of Increase

- Most fees increasing between 5% and 10%
- Increases primarily tied to staffing costs
- FY 2023-24 updates were before finalization of contracts and didn't include full cost
- Average increase for County: 8.2% compared to prior year numbers used at fee hearing

Agriculture/Weights and Measures Total Change: \$126,422

- 2022 fee study called for increases to reach higher level of cost recovery over three years
- Department saw average cost increases of 12.4%, varying across the department
- Most fees in Land Stewardship and Weights and Measures divisions increasing by 16%
- Fees in Agricultural division increasing 4% with a few exception of cannabis and hemp (13-16%)

County Administrator's Office Total Change: \$3,821 (for Sheriff's Office)

- County Administrator's Office puts forward two statemandated fees on behalf of the Sheriff's office
- Jail Booking Fee only charged to arresting agencies if State does not appropriate funding – increasing 4.8%
- Jail Access Fee charged per state mandate to arresting agencies for certain misdemeanor arrests in excess of 3year average – increasing 7.0%
- All fee revenue collected by Sheriff's Office and supports booking operations

Health Services Total Change: \$272,169

Animal Services

- 283 fees increasing, all under 7%, average of 5.6%
- 29 fees decreasing, primarily boarding fees
- County subsidy will remain constant

Environmental Health

- 200 fees increasing, average is 11%
- Increase in line with labor costs
- Dairy fees are not being adjusted in this package

Permit Sonoma Total Change: \$1,591,557

- 660 fees are being increased
- Most fees increasing by 8.5%, in line with labor cost increases
- General Fund subsidy will remain constant
- Permit Sonoma continues to implement its Management Review, which will lead to improvements to services and may offset future cost increases

Public Infrastructure (Airport fees) Total Change: \$6,646

- Airport operates as an enterprise and does not receive General Fund Support
- 35 fees increasing
 - About half increasing less than 5%
 - Some personnel badging penalties increasing at higher rates
- Four terminal advertising rates decreasing to match demand
- Change to parking schedule to allow 30 minutes free parking in short-term parking

Regional Parks Total Change: \$568,350

- 12 new fees, including peak season parking rate of \$10 for river parks, new summer camps, use fees for new turf fields, and cold storage parking at Mason's Marina
- Deleting 94 fees to simplify schedules
- Increases to 125 fees
 - Majority increasing less than 5%
 - No changes to fees at Marina's
 - No changes to visitor/membership fees except peak-demand river parking

Sheriff's Office Total Change: \$351,758

- 68 fees increasing,
 - Most increases less than 10% and in line with labor cost increases
 - Larger increases to carry concealed weapons permits based on state requirements
 - Most increased revenues associated with carry concealed weapons permits, which will offset increased cost of background checks
- Two fees decreasing as a result of time studies and changes to fleet costs
