

Attachment E: Examples of Other County Immigrant Services

Staff reached out to the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) to help identify examples of immigrant community services and/or data from other counties. Additionally, staff reviewed the State of Immigrant and Refugee Rights work in Alameda County, as directed by the Board at the January 23, 2024, Board meeting. Below are highlights of the findings from this review of immigration services work in other counties:

- Alameda County: The Office of Alameda County Supervisor Richard Valle convened an Ad Hoc Committee on Immigrant and Refugee Rights and commissioned a [report on the State of Immigrant and Refugee Rights in Alameda County](#), finalized on December 20, 2021. The primary focus of this Committee's work and report were on immigration rights, particularly related to immigration enforcement.
- Santa Clara County: In partnership with the American Immigration Council, with funding from the Gateways for Growth, Santa Clara County produced the September 2023 [New Americans in Santa Clara County report](#) on the demographic and economic contributions of immigrants in the county.
- San Diego County: The Office of Immigrant and Refugee Affairs serves as the regional expert and lead in immigrant and refugee affairs and provides resources and information through a variety of activities countywide.
- Los Angeles County: Their Office of Immigrant Affairs maintains an interactive [immigrant services map](#).
- Ventura County: Established a virtual and/or in the field farmworker resource center in 2019. The Center staff connect farmworkers and their employers to information and resources, with services that mostly include information and referral services.
- San Mateo County: Established a Farmworker Advisory Commission at the end of 2022. The Commission promotes programs and policies that address the unmet needs of farmworkers in San Mateo County.
