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**Resolution Of The Board Of Supervisors Of The County Of Sonoma, State Of California,  
Terminating The Proclamation of Local Emergency Due To The Kincade Fire, Exacerbated By  
Mandatory Evacuations, The Extreme Fire Danger Created By Successive Wind Events, And  
Corresponding De-Energization In The Sonoma County Operational Area**

**Whereas**, on October 24, 2019, the Director of Emergency Services for the County of Sonoma Issued a Proclamation of a Local Emergency for the County of Sonoma, State of California related to the Kincade Fire and risk of additional fires in light of the Kincade fire, extreme fire danger weather and concurrent Pacific Gas and Electric (“PG&E”) de-energization events underway and anticipated (the “Director’s Declaration of Local Emergency”); and

**Whereas**, on October 31, 2019, the Board of Supervisors ratified the Director’s Declaration of Local Emergency; and

**Whereas**, the Sonoma County Health Officer issued a Proclamation of Local Health Emergency on October 30, 2019, due to contaminated debris from household hazardous waste/materials and structural debris resulting from the destruction of the large number of structures. On November 5, 2019, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 19-0475 ratifying the Health Officer's Proclamation of a Local Health Emergency; and

**Whereas**, California Government Code section 8630 of Article 14, Local Emergency, of Chapter 7 of the Emergency Services Act requires that the County review the need for continuing the local emergency at least once every 60 days until the local governing body terminates the local emergency; and

**Whereas**, the Board of Supervisors finds that the conditions of extreme peril are now deemed not to be beyond the control of the normal protective services, personnel, equipment and facilities within the Sonoma County Operational Area, and that all contaminated debris from household hazardous waste/materials and structural debris resulting from the destruction of the large number of structures has now been cleared.

**Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved** the Board of Supervisors does hereby terminate the Proclamation of Local Emergency, ratified by Resolution No. 19-0473 and thereafter supplemented by Resolution No. 19-0561, effective immediately upon adoption of this resolution.
