

State and Federal Budget/Policy Implications

- Changes at Federal level are impacting pending grants for Broadband infrastructure and digital access and equity.
- While these grants are not needed to fund EDC's day-to-day Broadband staffing, changes in future grant program eligibility will have a large impact on planned services, particularly related to digital access, affordability, device distribution, and digital literacy training.

Key Opportunities and Challenges

- Opportunity staffing changes will provide additional resources to be directed towards business services, strategic economic planning, and partnerships, building on the EDB 3.0 plan
- Challenge potential economic headwinds for local businesses and the community at large resulting from federal economic policy

Key Operational Objectives

- Continue to implement recommendations of the EDB 3.0 Plan:
 - Increase access to resources for local businesses and economic development organization partners.
 - Increase presence of Business Diversity Program in community.
- Expand the EDC's research capabilities to provide economic analysis that guides decision-making around select County projects and better informs the community with regards to economic forecasting and reporting.
- Advance policies, practices and partnerships that promote broadband access and bridge the digital divide.
