Resolution Of The Board Of Directors Of The Sonoma Valley County Sanitation District Adopting a Conflict of Interest Code

Whereas, the Political Reform Act, Government Code sections 81000 et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt conflict of interest codes, and

Whereas, the Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code and which can be incorporated by reference and may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission after public notice and hearings to conform to amendments to the Political Reform Act, and

Whereas, the Sonoma Valley County Sanitation District wishes to adopt this standard code and designate which officers and employees should disclose financial interests and describe which interests must be disclosed; and

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved:

- The terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs. Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference and, along with the attached Appendix A and Appendix B, in which members and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Sonoma Valley County Sanitation District (District), and
- 2. Pursuant to Section 4 of the standard code, the directors and general manager shall file statements of economic interest electronically with the Clerk of the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors. Designated employees shall file statements with the District clerk who shall retain them at the main place of business of the District. Any designated employee already required to submit a disclosure statement (Form 700) pursuant to Government Code section 87203 may submit a copy of that statement in lieu of any filing required by this code provided that no additional disclosure

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would be required by this code.

- 3. Investments and business positions in business entities, gifts and income from sources, which provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment of the type utilized by or provided by the employee's department or division.

¹ Only investments in and sources of income from business entities, and sources of income (including gifts) which do business in the geographic area of the District, or real property interests located in that area, need to be reported.
