**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SONOMA VALLEY COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT
AUTHORIZING THE GENERAL MANAGER TO PERIODICALLY UPDATE THE SEWER SYSTEM MANAGEMENT
PLANS AS NECESSARY TO REFLECT CURRENT REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS AND BEST PRACTICES.**

Whereas, the State Water Resources Control Board has established Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Sanitary Sewer Systems; and

Whereas, the purpose of the Waste Discharge Requirements is to develop a regulatory mechanism to provide a consistent statewide approach for reducing sanitary sewer overflows; and

Whereas, pursuant to the statewide Waste Discharge Requirements, public agencies that own and operate sanitary sewer systems greater than one mile in length were required to develop a Sewer System Management Plan in accordance with Order No. WQO 2022-0103-DWQ requirements and present it to the agency's governing board for approval at a public meeting; and

Whereas, the Sonoma Valley County Sanitation Districts developed a Sewer System Management Plan based on the Waste Discharge Requirements and certified their various elements with the governing board within the specified time frame, and

Whereas, the Sonoma Valley County Sanitation District manages programs to implement the Sewer System Management Plans; and

Whereas, the Waste Discharge Requirements requires that the Sewer System Management Plan be updated every six (6) years, that the update include any significant program changes, and that recertification by the governing board is required when significant updates to the Sewer System Management Plan are made, and

Whereas, the Sewer System Management Plans have been updated by staff in accordance with Order No. WQO 2022-0103-DWQ.

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Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved the Board of Directors of the Sonoma Valley County Sanitation District, approves the August 2025 Sewer System Management Plan update and the implementation of the sewer system programs, and authorizes the General Manager to periodically update the Sewer System Management Plan as necessary to reflect current regulatory requirements and best practices.
