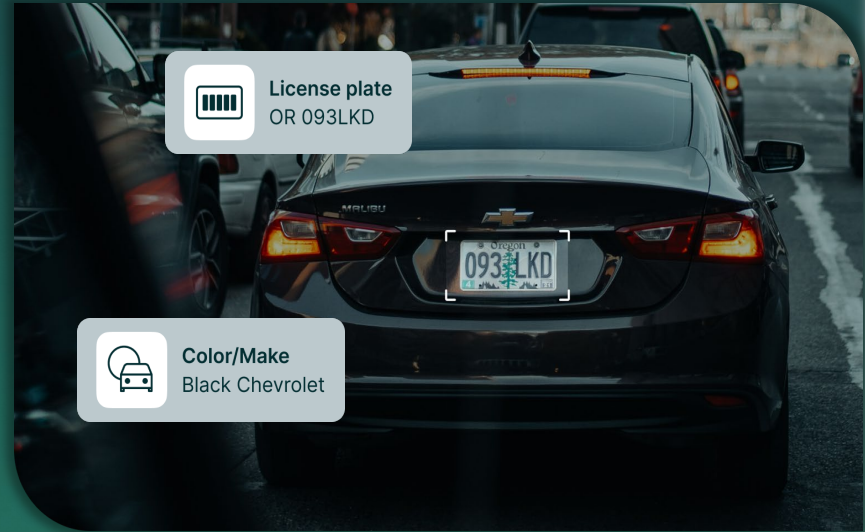
What is Flock Safety?



What is ALPR?

Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) technology scans passing vehicles to capture readable images of license plates and vehicles.

The technology provides automated searching for stolen vehicles or vehicles associated with an active criminal investigation.



What is not captured:

- No people
- No facial recognition
- No traffic enforcement
- Indiscriminate evidence

What This IS

- License plate recognition
- Gathers objective evidence and facts about vehicles, not people
- Alerts law enforcement of wanted vehicles
- Used to solve crimes
- Adheres to all state laws

What This is NOT

- Not facial recognition
- Not tied to Personal Identifiable Information
- Not used for traffic enforcement
- Data not stored beyond 30 days → *automatically deletes every 30 days*
- Not unlawful sharing of information

- Funded by Vehicle Code 9250.14
- Sheriff is designated fiscal agent
- Partnership with Sonoma County Law Enforcement Agencies
- Mission to investigate and prosecute vehicle theft crimes

Policies, Privacy, and Procedures

Protecting Privacy

- Footage owned by Agency/City and will never be sold or shared by Flock
- 30 day data retention, then deleted
- Short retention period ensures that all data not associated with a crime is automatically deleted & unrecoverable
- Takes human bias out of crime-solving by detecting objective data, and detecting events that are objectively illegal (ex. stolen vehicles)
- All data is stored securely in the Amazon Web Services cloud, and end to end encryption of all data
- Search reason is required for audit trail
- NOT facial recognition software
- NO Personal Identifying Information (PII) is contained in Flock
- NOT used for traffic enforcement
- Not connected to registration data or 3rd party databases (Carfax, DMV)

Procedures

- All camera locations and users will have approved ALPR policy by applicable governing body
- Sheriff's Policy on Sheriff's website complies with all laws and regulations, including Civil Code 1798.90.50-1798.90.55 pertaining to policy, including data sharing, and data security matters
- All Flock Safety database inquiries will require same criteria as other existing law enforcement investigative databases (reasonable cause)
- All users must complete required training
- Data will not be shared with agencies outside of the State of California without court order
