Supervisor Coursey;

I hope you will consider again serving as champion for Council on Aging and bring forward our request for a waiver of fees for our Annual Food Permit to the Board of Supervisors. Fortunately for many years, the Board of Supervisors has continued to fully support fee waivers for our program.

Currently Council on Aging's Meals on Wheels kitchen located on 30 Kawana Spring's Rd. in Santa Rosa is producing and providing 29,000 meals each month for seniors here in Sonoma County and requires the Annual Food Permit issued by the County of Sonoma. In addition, Council on Aging provides meals in a congregate setting in 10 dining sites across Sonoma County, providing meals to seniors who are still driving and may identify as food insecure. The meals provide healthy nutrition and the dining experience helps seniors remain socially engaged, reducing their risk of isolation. These sites also require the Annual Food Permit.

This year the County Department of Health Services has assessed us fees totaling \$6,330.40 this year for inspection services provided at the sites. We are requesting a waiver of these fees.

The Council on Aging receives funding from the county Area Agency on Aging through the federal Older Americans Act, other Adult and Aging contracts. This combined funding provides 65% of the cost of our nutrition programs. Grants, client and general donations, and fund raising events provide the additional revenue necessary to provide these meals. Our clients are asked for a donation to offset the cost of the meal; however, most are living below the poverty level and either make no contribution or a minimal one. It is important to note that this meal is, for most of our clients, critical to meeting minimal nutritional needs and enables them to continue to live outside of institutional settings. More than half our clients say that this one hot meal provides 75% of their daily caloric intake.

The amount Council on Aging would need to spend for this permit would provide 1825 meals and feed five seniors for an entire year. We respectfully request a waiver of these fees.

Our Mission

To enhance the quality of life for our aging community by providing services that promote well-being and maintain independence.

The Council on Aging has successfully run the Meals on Wheels Program for thirty-nine years. Last year we provided over 248,000 meals to seniors in need in Sonoma County. This number continues to grow and this year we are on track to provide over 260,000 meals. Hunger is often about the lack of a support system and access to food. Our Meals on Wheels program helps seniors fight hunger and isolation every day. Currently the Meals on Wheels Program provide seniors one meal per day. For many of the seniors we serve it is often the only meal they eat each day. Quite simply they need more food. By ensuring adequate nutrient intake, the Dietary Reference Intakes prevent nutrient deficiencies and reduce the risk of chronic diseases, such as osteoporosis, cancer, and cardiovascular disease. The more food we can provide the more positive effect we can have on overall health, healing, and quality of life for our seniors in Sonoma County. The daily contact with the Meals on Wheels Drivers is often the only physical contact seniors have each day.

The Current Condition of the Senior Population in Sonoma County:

We know there are over 138,000 persons age 60 and older represent 28% of the total population in Sonoma County. One third of the senior population is age 75 or older. Moreover, 22.1% of county seniors over 65 live in poverty. For seniors 75 and older the percentage rises to 27.2%. For seniors who are poor and homebound, hunger and a host of problems related to isolation pose significant risks to overall health and quality of life, and are more likely to require institutionalization than the senior population overall. Of the 2200 clients in our Meals on Wheels Program for 2021-2022, 52% were living at or below the poverty line.

Future Projected Senior Population:

In 2030 31% of the population in Sonoma County will be over 65 years old.

The Meals on Wheels Program is offered to all homebound seniors 60 years and over living in our service area (which includes all of Sonoma County except Petaluma) regardless of ability to pay. Our agency strives to serve everyone regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, sexual identity or preference, or income level. Recent data indicate that 12% of our clients are Hispanic and an additional 11% are a mix of African American, American Indian or other ethnic minority. Spanish speaking staff and written materials are available to those who need them. The needs assessment and care plan prepared for all program clients strive to overcome barriers for seniors by providing other services either through Council on Aging or outside resources. This service addresses eligibility for entitlement programs such as Medi-Cal and SSI, food programs, transportation, legal assistance and money management, in home support services, mental health services, and more.



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It is a program objective to provide Meals on Wheels to eligible seniors without waiting lists or other service delays. Whenever possible delivery routes are expanded or new routes created to serve our clients when the need arises.

Currently there is a ZERO waiting list

Meals on Wheels Senior Nutrition Programs:

The Meals on Wheels Program: successfully addresses the risks of hunger and isolation among temporarily or permanently homebound seniors who are not able to provide for themselves without assistance. The program delivers a fresh meal containing one third of the recommended daily requirement 5 days a week. *There are currently over 50 meal delivery routes in Sonoma County. Often the route drivers are the only contact seniors have each day.*

The Weekend Meals Program: provide for seniors who are at an elevated at-risk status because they have no other support for their nutritional needs through the weekend. We developed this service for Saturday and Sunday meals for our most vulnerable seniors because we found many went without food on days we did not deliver.

Congregate Dining Sites: offer seniors the opportunity for socialization, companionship, activities, and nutritious meals daily. *We operate and serve at 10 senior dining sites in Sonoma County.*

Daily Meal Choice: in order to ensure everyone receives a meal they can eat and enjoy, we offer 3 meals choices each day. Each day there is a vegetarian option, a poultry option and a third option of beef, pork or fish.

Kibbles of Kindness Program: In 2012 we implemented this program to provide pet food to our seniors who were sharing their Meals on Wheels with their pets because they could not afford pet food. In fact, pets may help elderly owners live longer, healthier, and more enjoyable lives. *We currently provide for over 100 pets.*

Drive-Up Pick-Up - During COVID, when dining sites had to remain closed, Council on Aging began offering Drive-Up Pick-Up sites where still mobile seniors could come and pick up a 5 day meal pack-up. With 8 sites still operational throughout Sonoma County, food insecure seniors who are not comfortable attending a meal site, continue to be able to access meals. These sites provide approximately 6000 meals per month.

The Senior Social Club- Adult Day Programs: supports both independence and well-being of seniors, many of whom are functionally and/or cognitively impaired, by providing the emotional, mental and social stimulation that is necessary to remain independent and healthy. Meals are provided to seniors participating in this program. *There are 4 of these programs in Sonoma County run by the Council on Aging.*

CalFresh: We are currently working with the Sonoma County Health Department in providing presentations, and materials to seniors, and assistance in filling out the required application. This provides more resources to seniors with



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In strengthening our relationships with local hospitals and clinics we are meeting with management and discharge staff to discuss ways we can insure seniors who are being released have access to nutrition, and nutrition resources. This involves a commitment by medical staff to ask simple questions regarding food accessibility at home during the discharge planning process. If seniors are connected to Meals on Wheels and/or other food resources, they will heal faster, and remain independent in their home longer.

The Center for Effective Government recently found that for every \$1 invested in Meals on Wheels programs, there is up to a \$50 return in Medical/Medicaid savings alone. By keeping people in their own homes, Meals on Wheels can feed a senior for an entire year for about the same cost as a 24-hour hospital visit or a six-day nursing home stay.



Additionally, Brown University released a study that found investing more in home-delivered meals can keep America's seniors out of nursing homes. Specifically, the research found that, for every additional \$25 a state spends on home-delivered meals per person, it can expect a 1% decrease in the number of nursing-home-eligible seniors who actually move into nursing homes. Nationally, this can translate into billions of dollars in Medical/Medicaid savings alone.

If a senior ends up in a skilled nursing facility in California the average cost is over \$117,000 per year for very basic care which does not include prescriptions, emergency care, or hospital stay.

As our population ages, changing demographics will have a profound impact on the demand for social services, especially the need for nutrition assistance. In addition to strengthening our nutrition safety net to better meet current needs, we must also take steps now to ensure that it can evolve to meet future needs. That means strengthening partnerships with other senior services agencies to help inform and improve access to nutrition assistance. Working together, the nutrition and seniors' community can leverage each other's strengths to better meet the nutritional needs of our aging population and ensure that our most fragile seniors don't have to worry about where they will get their next meal.

Simply- Our goal is to keep seniors independent in their own homes longer through nutrition.



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Senior Nutrition Services is a program that provides nutritious meals to seniors who are unable to prepare meals for themselves. The program is designed to help seniors maintain their health and independence. Meals are delivered to the senior's home and are prepared by a professional chef. The program is available to seniors who are 60 years of age or older and live in Santa Rosa, CA. The program is funded by the Council on Aging and is a free service to seniors.



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food insecurity to access more food through the CalFresh EBT card. It also allows seniors to use the card at local Farmers Markets.

Veteran Services: The Meals on Wheels program currently provides for well over 300 Veterans. Our Veterans have access to all of the services we provide.

The Council on Aging offers 14 different programs or services for seniors in Sonoma County. They include some of the following:

- Case Management

Often times when our case managers do the in home interview/intake process they find the client is a veteran and connect them with resources that provide even more services for them like access to funds they did not know about, medical, food, housing assistance, and much more.

Meals on Wheels Funding:

Our program meal cost is \$9.00 per meal to purchase goods, prepare meals, and deliver to sites and clients. We ask clients for a \$4 donation (because \$5.00 is subsidized by County contracts which is always subject to change). On average we receive \$.76 cents for each meal due to the senior's financial inability to pay for meals. The balance needed to run the program is raised through events, donations, and grant and benefactors. In order to continue to provide the high level of service that we pride ourselves upon, at a time when client donations are declining due to the many financial pressures facing our most needy seniors, we are continuously looking for partnerships and collaborative relationships to support this critical need at this crucial time in our history.
