Redistricting Rules and Goals



1. Federal Laws

- Equal Population
- Federal Voting Rights Act
- No Racial Gerrymandering

2. California Criteria for Counties

To the extent practicable:

- 1. Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest"

(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)

- 3. Cities and Census-designated places
- 4. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 5. Compactness

(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

Prohibited:

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."

3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

- Minimize voters shifted to different election years
- Respect voters' choices / continuity in office
- Future population growth
- Preserving the core of existing districts


California criteria - order of priority



- 1. To the extent practicable, geographically contiguous.
- To the extent practicable, minimize division of community of interest. Consider whether should be included within a single supervisorial district for purposes of its effective and fair representation. <u>Communities of interest do not include</u> <u>relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates</u>.
- 3. To the extent practicable, minimizes division of a city.
- 4. To the extent practicable, bounded by natural and artificial barriers, by streets or by the boundaries of the county.
- 5. To the extent practicable, where it does not conflict with the preceding criteria above, drawn to encourage compactness




