## NOFA Evaluation Criteria

#### E. Proposal Evaluation

The successful applicant(s) will be selected based on, but not limited to, the following criteria (and not necessarily in order of importance):

- 1. Overall Proposal Quality
- 2. Projected cost effectiveness more beds for less cost.
- 3. An ability to accept clients as soon as February 28, 2022
- An ability to maintain full operations for at least a duration that allows substantive supportive sheltering to be stood up to accommodate clients moving from the sites to supportive and/or stable housing.
- Geographic need the Board will evaluate your proposal with others and may award funds to geographic areas of Sonoma County that have the greatest need for a project.
- Adherence by the Proposer to the provisions of this NOFA, including but not limited to the Submittal Requirements.

# Briefly about Each Proposal

City of Santa Rosa

- A 24/7 Safe Parking operation for up to 50 cars/RVs
- At Utility Field Operations (UFO) site (Stony Point Road, near Finley Center)
- 2 Years of Operations planned

Petaluma/Committee on the Shelterless (COTS)

- A Non-Congregate Shelter proposal for 25 persons/couples
- At current COTS site (900 Hopper, Petaluma)
- 3 years of planned operations

### County of Sonoma

- An Non-Congregate Shelter proposal for up to 18 persons
- At George's Hideaway in West County, assuming Homekey purchase
- About a year of planned operations

# Briefly about Each Proposal

Sonoma Applied Village Services (SAVS)

- 24/7 Safe Parking at the SoCo Fairgrounds' Aston Barns site (does not involve Barn removal)
- Up to 36 recreational vehicles, some autos

Homeless Action Sonoma (HAS)

- Non-Congregate Shelter north of City of Sonoma at HAS-owned site (18820 Sonoma Highway)
- Goal is to house and support 22 persons in Quickhavens
- Would lead towards a permanent supportive housing use @ same site.

### Hanna Boys Center

- Renovation of three existing buildings into dorm-style buildings to house up to 30 Transition-Aged Youth (TAY).
- Asks for an ongoing subsidy per person housed.
