Fire Agency Consolidation and Stabilization Agreements and Funding Efforts

July 20, 2021 BOS Direction

Authorized \$2 million to stabilize the Bodega Bay Fire District

Authorized CAO to negotiate consolidation agreements with key fire agency partner using \$7.9 million in authorized funding

Direct staff to coordinate with FSWG on a potential new sales tax effort

Ongoing Fire Services Project Funding

- Measure L TOT \$2.2 million
- Prop 172 \$4.2 million
- Budget Hearings \$1.5 million
- CSA 40 Prop. Taxes \$2.3 million

Additional Sources Needed

- TOT Funds for Dispatch \$900,000
- TOT Regional Parks Camping \$300,000
- Future Tax Effort \$1 million

Risks and Mitigation Efforts

- Pending Litigation
 - Global Covenant to not sue
- Timing of LAFCO Approval Process
 - Continue North Bay Contract

Fire Services Project

- Board established in 2014
- Goal: provide more efficient, effective, and sustainable fire services in Sonoma County
- 2017 fires galvanized need for a collaborative approach
- Fire Chiefs Association established the Strategic Leadership Group

FSP Recommendations

- Consolidate CSA 40 territory with professional districts
- County provide supplemental funding for key consolidations
- Pursue a fire sales tax to fund the analysis recommendations

Measure G

- Board authorized pursuit in January 2019
- ½ cent sales tax on March 2020 ballot
- Failed by 1.86%
- No private campaign

New Sales Tax Effort

- Board authorized in July 2021
- Improve outreach
- Incorporate veg management

Consultant Findings

- Fire protection and prevention remains an important issue, but...
- "Wrong track" voter sentiment highest in ten years
- Polling falls short for June and November
- Sunset provision should be considered

Staff Recommendation

- Do not pursue an effort in 2022
- •FSWG continue to educate on unmet need
- •Continue to collaborate with Fire, veg management, and other stakeholders for a potential measure in 2023 or 2024
