




Overall Countywide Trends


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New cases per 100,000 residents per day



COVID-19 hospitalizations




Overall test positivity

Lowest HPI test positivity

- Metrics as of 02/28/22:
 - 18.8 new cases per 100,000 residents per day
 - **5.5%** overall test positivity
 - 6.4% test positivity in lowest HPI quartile
- COVID-19 hospitalizations declining (**31** currently hospitalized)
- **51** people have died from COVID-19 since January 01, 2022


Case Rates by Race/Ethnicity



American Indian/Alaskan Native residents are currently experiencing the highest case rates at 51 new cases per 100,000 residents per day, followed by Black/African American residents at 38 new cases per 100,000 per day

Testing Updates




- Currently conducting 477 PCR tests per 100,000 per day



Monitoring COVID-19 Variants




- Not all cases are currently genotyped due to high case volume
- Samples are genotyped locally at PHL (up to 64 per week), some by State labs, and some by Federal labs
- Prioritize samples tested to increase likelihood of detecting concerning new variants:
 - International travel
 - Severity of outcomes (hospitalization/death)
 - Large outbreaks
 - Booster breakthrough cases

Sonoma County Case Rates by Vaccination Status




 Sonoma County case rates during the Omicron surge have been substantially lower among fully vaccinated up-to-date (UTD) individuals (those still current on their initial vaccination series or boosted) than fully vaccinated individuals who are not up-to-date or unvaccinated individuals

Vaccine Booster Dose Administration

Proportion of eligible 12+ year-olds with booster dose, by Race/Ethnicity




- **63.5%** of currently eligible 12+ year-olds have received their booster doses
- 74.1% of eligible adults aged 50+ have received their booster doses

Sonoma County Vaccination Progress in Context


- Sonoma County currently has the 10th highest vaccination rate of the 58 counties in California
 - Population that is fully vaccinated: 77.0% (380,819 fully vaccinated)
 - **10.0% higher vaccination rate** than California
 - Cumulative deaths per 100k: 87 (431 total deaths)
 - 58.2% less deaths per 100k residents than California
 - Cumulative cases per 100k: 16,706 (82,584 total cases)
 - 25.4% less cases per 100k residents than California

Overall Vaccine Administration




Vaccination Status, by Race/Ethnicity



• Over 1,000,000 doses administered

 87% of the Sonoma County population aged 5+ is at least partially vaccinated (80% fully vaccinated; 7% partially vaccinated)

Vaccine Equity Measures



- Currently, 26% of vaccine doses have been administered to residents in the lowest quartile of the Healthy Places Index in which residents have access to the fewest resources
- 80% of residents aged 5+ in this quartile are at least partially vaccinated (7% partially vaccinated; 73% fully vaccinated)

Health Order Amendment

- This Amendment extends the compliance date for the twice weekly testing requirements of non-boosted personnel (in fire/law/EMS, dental, pharmacy, temporary disaster shelter and K-12 Education) until April 1, 2022
- The booster vaccine verification and face covering requirement for non-boosted personnel remain in effect
- PH will meet with stakeholders later this week to discuss making further changes to these orders

On the Move CURA

 Overview of CURA program and services, including EFA (Emergency Financial Assistance)



Distribution of Emergency Financial Assistance (EFA)

To date, CURA has distributed \$8,539,726 to high need, low-income families impacted by COVID (County funds \$7,789,726; Other funds: \$750,000)

• EFA average daily burn rate:

- On average, the average daily burn rate for EFA is approximately \$29,000 per day
- During surge months, the average daily burn rate is approximately \$63,000 per day
- Anticipated # of applications that still to be processed for EFA:
 - As of 2/23/22, there are 791 people on the waitlist
 - On average, 50 individuals get added to the waitlist every week
- Immediate Need:
 - With additional EFA, CURA has the ability to reach an estimated 2,117 individuals by June 30th 2022

• Long Term Need:

- An estimated 9,500 individuals remain to be served
- This estimate is calculated utilizing census data showing the number of low-income Latinx individuals in Sonoma County, considering the COVID positive rate of Latinx individuals, less the number of Latinx individuals already served by CURA

Recommended Actions

- Authorize the Director of Health Services, or designee, to execute the fourth amendment to an agreement with On The Move for continued COVID-19 emergency response efforts, increasing the fiscal year 2021-2022 contract amount by \$3,875,000 for a new total not-to-exceed amount of \$18,338,835 through June 30, 2022.
- Adopt a resolution authorizing budgetary adjustments to the fiscal year 2021-2022 adopted budget, appropriating \$3,875,000 to reflect revenue and expenditures associated with a services agreement supporting COVID-19 emergency response efforts. (4/5th Vote Required)
