Interdepartmental Multidisciplinary Team (IMDT) Cohorts

On May 3rd 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved an extension of 10 positions for one year on the IMDT Expansion team. The Expansion team supports IMDT cohorts specifically the Homeless Encampment and Resource Team (HEART). Measure O is the primary funding for these positions. The IMDT Expansion team provides outreach, intensive case management, and housing referrals.

Mobile Support Team (MST) Expansion / Crisis, Assessment, Prevention, and Education (CAPE)

The Mobile Support Team (MST) Expansion / Crisis, Assessment, Prevention, and Education (CAPE) category still has funding unallocated. County staff are working with school superintendents and SCOE leadership to put together a proposal to increase Behavioral Health services for students in our public school system.
