The Geyserville Planning Committee held a public meeting on May 22, 2018 at which time Mr. Art Torano made a presentation of his project. This was the fourth appearance Mr. Torano made at our meetings. He entertained questions from the well attended community audience assembled. A discussion with the Geyserville Committee members followed. On the basis of this discussion and the Committee's subsequent deliberation, a motion was proposed and unanimously approved:

- 1. The Geyserville Planning Committee supports new mixed use projects in it's small downtown area, especially if new housing is included. The Torano project represents such a project and is located on a highly visible and central parcel at the corner of Geyserville Avenue and SR 128.
- 2. Assure that all County Code-based parking spaces required for the project, plus any loss of existing on-street parking; including any counted toward meeting the projects parking requirement, are provided on-site or designated off-site spaces nearby.
- 3. Assure that this project by virtue of its construction, does not trigger requirements for a bike lane extending beyond the project site on SR 128 and related loss of on-street parking spaces, which would negatively affect business throughout the downtown area.

- 4. Explore the possibility of under-grounding existing aerial utilities in existing underutilized conduits that border the project site.
- 5. Assure the final design of the building and the materials used are consistent with the design themes and characters of the buildings existing in downtown Geyserville. Current illustrative drawings were a topic of discussion by some members of the public, for not meeting this criteria.
