No Place Like Home Program

- \$2 Billion statewide for development of permanent supportive housing
- Program serves persons with severe mental illness who are homeless, chronically homeless or at risk of chronic homelessness
- Noncompetitive vs. Competitive Funds
- Successful first round: \$22 million for 114 units:
 - Burbank Housing's Caritas Homes (74 units)
 - DanCo Communities (50 units)



No Place Like Home Plan

- Requirement for Noncompetitive allocation of \$3,935,834
- This Plan meets requirements to secure Sonoma County's Noncompetitive allocation
- After the Noncompetitive allocation is accepted, further consultation will occur with both Home Sonoma County and the Board of Supervisors.

Challenges Identified

- Housing crisis, exacerbated by the 2017 fire disaster
- Local government revenue is insufficient to fully fund safety net and justice services
- Consumers experience fragmented, duplicative service delivery
- Inadequate public transportation
- Coordinated Entry System in early stages of implementation
- New State definition, "at risk of chronic homelessness," misaligned with federal definitions and funding eligibility.



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Encouraging Progress


- ACCESS Sonoma Initiative
 - Eliminating barriers between protected data systems
 - Better serving the County's most vulnerable residents
- Robust efforts to prevent criminalization of homelessness and address service gaps through Mentally III Offender Task Force
- 1,070 existing permanent supportive housing beds



Need for Permanent Supportive Housing

Based on 2018 Homeless Count data, and system utilization and vulnerability data, the Commission estimates 1,306 more units of permanent supportive housing are needed.

- 114 units supported with recent No Place Like Home competitive awards
- 246 more units are in the housing pipeline
- 946 additional units needed

Key Goals and Strategies

- Continually increase coordination
 - Build Home Sonoma County
 - Expand ACCESS Sonoma Initiative
- Geographic equity: homeless housing & services in underserved communities
- Expand homeless access to rental assistance
- Address service gaps
 - Mentally III Offender Task Force
- Training to become a client centered system of care
- Use peer navigators to ensure cultural competency





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Recommended Actions

•Accept the No Place Like Home Plan, a required submission for acceptance of the No Place Like Home Non-Competitive Allocation.

•Adopt a resolution authorizing the Commission to enter into, execute, and deliver documents required to be awarded the No Place Like Home Noncompetitive Allocation Award Documents.
