On behalf of Attorney General William P. Barr, it is my pleasure to inform you that the Office of Justice Programs has approved your application for funding under the FY 2019 Transforming Family Justice Center Services: Creating New Pathways of Hope and Healing for Polyvictims in the amount of \$850,000 for Sonoma County District Attorney's Office. The money for this award comes from the Crime Victims Fund, which is administered by the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC). It is derived not from tax dollars, but from fines, penalty assessments, and bond forfeitures of convicted federal criminal offenders. The U.S. Attorneys in each District play a critical role in securing these funds to benefit federal, tribal, state, and local crime victims' programs. This Cooperative Agreement reflects the continuing commitment of the Department of Justice to improve the treatment of crime victims. This award is made under a program entitled OVC FY 2019 Transforming Family Justice Center Services: Creating New Pathways of Hope and Healing for Polyvictims." The money for this award was authorized by 34 U.S.C. § 20103(c)(1)(A).

Congratulations on your recent award! The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) has been delegated the responsibility for ensuring that recipients of federal financial assistance from the OJP, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), and the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) are not engaged in discrimination prohibited by law. Several federal civil rights laws, such as Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, require recipients of federal financial assistance to give assurances that they will comply with those laws. In addition to those civil rights laws, many grant program statutes contain nondiscrimination provisions that require compliance with them as a condition of receiving federal financial assistance.
