**Resolution Of The Board Of Supervisors Of The County Of Sonoma, State Of California,  
Ratifying the Proclamation of A Local Emergency Due To Potential PG&E De-Energization Of  
The Electrical Systems In The Sonoma County Operational Area**

**Whereas**, on October 21, 2019, the Director of Emergency Services for the County of Sonoma Issued a Proclamation of a Local Emergency for the County of Sonoma, State of California related to PG&E's potential de-energization of the electrical system within a substantial portion of the Sonoma County Operational Area (the "Director's Declaration of Local Emergency"); and

**Whereas**, pursuant to Sonoma County Code Chapter 10, Article 1, Section 10-5, where the Director of Emergency Services proclaims a local emergency, the Board of Supervisors must ratify said declaration within seven days after such proclamation; and

**Whereas**, the Board of Supervisors does hereby find that the circumstances of the potential de-energization as described in the Director's Declaration of Local Emergency do support and justify the declaration of local emergency set forth therein.

**Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved** the Board of Supervisors does hereby ratify the Director's Declaration of Local Emergency, effective immediately upon the adoption of this resolution; and

**Be It Further Resolved and Proclaimed** that said Local Emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the Sonoma County Board of

Supervisors; and

**Be It Further Resolved and Proclaimed** that the County Administrator is delegated authority to execute a Non-disclosure Agreement with PG&E to receive confidential customer information in a de-energization event; and

**It Is Requested** that the Governor of the State of California proclaim a State of Emergency due to the potential de-energization of the electrical systems in the State of California, waive regulations that may hinder response and recovery efforts, and make available California Disaster Assistance Act funding.
