PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY

FOR THE COUNTY OF SONOMA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 and the Sonoma County Code section 10.5, empower the Board of Supervisors to proclaim the existence of a local emergency when Sonoma County is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity; and

WHEREAS, the County of Sonoma Code of Ordinances, Chapter 10, Article 1(b) empowers the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence of a Local Emergency when the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors is not in session, and

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services finds:

- (1) That at the time of this proclamation the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors is not in session:
- (2) The United States of America has confirmed cases of individuals who have a severe acute respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus ("COVID-19" or "the virus") first detected in Wuhan, Hubei Province, People's Republic of China ("China"). The virus was first reported in China on December 31, 2019. As of March 2, 2020, the World Health Organization ("WHO") has reported more than 3,000 deaths stemming from approximately 89,000 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and the virus is present in 67 countries. The number of confirmed cases has continued to escalate dramatically over ashort period of time; and
- (3) WHO officials now report that sustained human-to-human transmission of the virus is occurring. Transmission from asymptomatic individuals has been documented. Suspected community transmission of the virus is occurring in the United States. Although the majority of individuals infected with COVID-19 recover from the disease without special treatment, there is significant potential for serious infection and death; and
- (4) On January 30, 2020, WHO declared the COVID-19 outbreak a public health emergency of international concern, and on January 31, 2020, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health Emergency for the United States of America; and

- (5) The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") has determined that the virus presents a serious public health threat, requiring coordination among state and local health departments to ensure readiness for potential heal threats associated with the virus; and
- (6) The CDC has issued guidelines to local and state health departments, including the County of Sonoma's Department of Health Services ("DHS"), concerning risk assessment and public health management of persons with potential exposure to COVID-19. These guidelines require DHS to make extraordinary efforts to monitor ongoing communicable disease threats and prepare for management of individuals who may have been exposed to COVID-19; and
- **(7)** DHS, the Department of Emergency Management, and other County partners have been working diligently and successfully to implement the CDC guidelines, but now require additional tools and resources to protect the public health given the current state of the epidemic and the need for a sustained response; and
- (8) The County's Public Health Officer has found that the conditions constituting a threat to community health, including a presumptive case of community infection, may be present in the County warranting a proclamation of a Local Health Emergency; and
- (9)The County's Public Health Officer has determined that DHS cannot implement with CDC's guidance without immediate action beyond the County's ordinary response capabilities, including directing personnel and resources from other County departments to assist with the ongoing and developing threat of COVID-19; and
- That conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen (10)within the County caused by the threat of COVID-19 that will impact significant County and community operations, including critical public infrastructure and services, and which will require the provision of additional public safety and emergency services; and
- (11)That the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril warrant and necessitate the proclamation of a Local Emergency to enable the County of Sonoma and other local government entities to adequately plan, prepare and preposition resources to be able to effectively respond to the threat posed by

1	COVID-19, and to warn Sonoma County residents and visitors of the threat posed by COVID-19 and to
2	enable them sufficient time to plan and prepare; now, therefore,
3	IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED that a Local Emergency exists throughout Sonoma
4	County, commencing on or about 10:00 a.m. of the 2 nd day of March, 2020; and
5	IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said
6	Local Emergency, the powers, functions and duties of the Director of Emergency Services shall be those
7	prescribed by state law and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved plan of the County of Sonoma in
8	order to mitigate the effects of said Local Emergency; and
9	IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that said Local Emergency shall be
10	deemed to continue to exist for the next seven (7) days, and hereafter by ratification of the Sonoma County
11	Board of Supervisors, until its termination is proclaimed by the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors; and
12	IT IS FURTHER ORDERED all County officers and employees take all steps requested
13	by the Public Health Officer and/or the Director of Emergency Services to prevent the spread of COVID-
14	19 and to prevent or alleviate illness or death due to the virus; and
15	IT IS FURTHER ORDERED all County officers and employees take all steps requested
16	by the Public Health Officer and/or the Director of Emergency Services to qualify the County for
17	reimbursement from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and for other state and federal relief as
18	may be available to reimburse the County for the expenses it incurs in addressing this emergency; and
19	IT IS REQUESTED that the Governor of the State of California proclaim a State of
20	Emergency due to the threat posed by COVID-19 in the State of California; include the County of Sonoma
21	in any emergency declaration by the State; ensure the County of Sonoma is included in any emergency
22	declaration that may be issued by the President of the United States of America; waive regulations that may
23	hinder response and recovery efforts; and make available California Disaster Assistance Act and State
24	Private Nonprofit Organizations Assistance Program funding.
