

Approval of Burbank Housing Development Corporation Refinance for Community Development Commission Loans

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Community Development Commission Role

- The Commission is the lead County government agency responsible for creating access to stable and affordable housing for our lowest income residents.
- Using a complex array of funding sources, the Commission provides loans to housing developers, which attract other funding sources. Commission investments in housing development are typically leveraged more than 10:1.
- Over the past five years, the Commission has supported the development or preservation of more than 1000 affordable housing units.


Burbank Housing is a **local** nonprofit dedicated to building quality affordable housing in the North Bay.

Burbank Refinance Request

 A cash-out refinance of senior debt on 6 properties on which CDC holds 21 subordinate loans:

Bodega Hills Lavell Village Sea Ranch 31 Firehouse Village Park Land Wilford Lane

• Burbank does not intend to repay any of the subordinate Commissionheld debt as part of the refinance.



Benefits of the Request

Burbank expects \$5.5 million in cash to:

Weather the loss of rental income due to the Coronavirus pandemic;

Support new development;

Renovate properties with deep affordability; and

Repay debt on Lantana project to ensure affordable sales prices

Necessary Authority

- The Board-approved CDC Loan Policies allow the Executive Director to subordinate CDC loans when it is compatible with the Policies.
- Because the changes to the Subordination Agreement impact the security of the loans, signing them is beyond the scope of the Executive Director's delegated authority.
- Proceeding with these subordinations requires Board approval.



Recommended Actions

- Approve Refinance of senior indebtedness
- Approve subordination of CDC loans
- Authorize CDC Interim Executive Director to execute subordination agreement and related documents
- Authorize CDC Interim Executive Director to complete letter agreement
- Authorize Interim Executive Director to negotiate, finalize, and execute documents to complete the transaction
