

EXHIBIT D

DESCRIPTION OF RATE ZONES

Rate Zone areas for this Agreement are described below.

Eastern Sonoma County/Petaluma Zone

Eastern Sonoma County Area: The unincorporated eastern area of Sonoma County, serving residences and businesses inside a boundary line starting at the intersection of Sears Point Road (Hwy. 37) and Tolay Creek (just east of Arnold Drive/Hwy. 121), continuing east along Sears Point Road (Hwy. 37) to the Napa/Sonoma County line, then northerly along the County line to the northeast corner of Sec. 1, T11N, R9W, then southwesterly to the intersection of Barr Ranch Road and Ridge Oaks Road, crossing Geysers Road at its intersection with Geysers Resort Road, then west, crossing Highway 101 at Seghesio Road, crossing Dutcher Creek Road just south of Knecht Road, to the center of the Dry Creek arm of Lake Sonoma, then southeast along the center of the lake basin to the Warm Springs Dam, then southerly, including West Dry Creek Road and Dry Creek Road, crossing West Side Road at Wohler Bridge, continuing along Wohler Road to River Road, then southerly, encompassing Vine Hill Road, to the intersection of Vine Hill Road and Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116), and then along Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116) to Occidental Road, then east along Occidental Road to the Santa Rosa city limits, then going east then south, along the perimeter of Santa Rosa to Kawana Springs Road, then southerly, excluding Petaluma Hill Road, to Snyder Lane, along Snyder Lane to the Rohnert Park city limits, following the Rohnert Park city limit to, but not including, Keiser Avenue, then easterly to the top of Sonoma Mountain, then southward generally following the ridge of Sonoma Mountain to its intersection with Stage Gulch Road (Hwy. 116), then east on Stage Gulch Road (Hwy. 116) to Arnold Drive (excluding the Chantrelle, Creekside Village and Temelec developments north of Stage Gulch Road), and then south along Arnold Drive (Hwy. 116 and 121) to its intersection with Sears Point Road (Hwy. 37), at Tolay Creek.

Petaluma Area: Serving the unincorporated areas south and east of Petaluma, including along the Hwy. 101 corridor south of the Petaluma city limits and the eastern side of Petaluma, bounded on the south by Frates Road, on the east by Old Adobe Road to Washington Street, then westerly to Ely Road at Bionda Lane, then northerly along Ely Road to Corona Road, then west to the Petaluma city limits.

Southwest Santa Rosa Zone (for OPTION 1 this becomes a subzone of East Sonoma County; for OPTION 2 this stays as is)

This zone consists of high density development areas that are unincorporated County islands within the incorporated southwest area of the City of Santa Rosa. Generally these unincorporated islands are within the area bounded along the north by Hwy 12, bounded on the east by Hwy 101, bounded on the south by West Robles Avenue, and bounded on the west by South Wright Road. They specifically are as shown on the Southwest Santa Rosa Zone map included in this Exhibit D.

Larkfield Zone (for OPTION 1 this becomes a subzone of East Sonoma County; for OPTION 2 this stays as is)

The boundaries of this zone are equal to the Larkfield Urban Service Boundary on file with the Sonoma County Department of Permit and Resource Management a copy of which is included in this Exhibit D.

Sebastopol/South Sonoma County Zone

Sebastopol Area: Unincorporated area adjacent to and surrounding the City of Sebastopol, serving residences and businesses inside a boundary line initially going south, following Watertrough Road from its intersection with Bodega Highway, onto Pleasant Hill Road, then east and continuing north on Bloomfield Road, to Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116), then east on Cooper Road to its end, then continuing easterly to Llano Road at its intersection with Ludwig Ave., continuing east on Ludwig to Wright Road, then north on Wright Road to the intersection with Occidental Road, then west on Occidental Road to Gravenstein Hwy. (Hwy. 116), then south to Mill Station Road, then west on Mill Station approximately 1/2 mile, then south to the intersection of Bodega Hwy. with Water Trough Road.

South Sonoma County Area: Unincorporated area serving residences and businesses inside a boundary line starting at the south end of the County on the west side of Tolay Creek, then west and north along the County line to Highway 1, then north to its intersection with Valley Ford Road, then easterly on Valley Ford Road to Roblar Road, then east on Roblar Road to Peterson Road, then north on Peterson Road to Blank Road, continuing north on Blank Road to Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116), then southeast on Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116) to Stony Point Road, then north on Stony Point Road to Wilfred Avenue, then east on Wilfred Avenue to the city limits of Rohnert Park, then turning south and following the Rohnert Park and Cotati city limits, continuing north to Keiser Avenue, then east on Keiser Ave. to Petaluma Hill Road, then south on Petaluma Hill Road (serving both sides of the road), to Anderson Lane, then southeast to Pressley Road at its intersection with Lichau Road, then along Lichau Road (serving both sides of the road) to its end, then southward generally following the ridge of Sonoma Mountain to its intersection with Stage Gulch Road (Hwy. 116), then west on Stage Gulch Road (Hwy. 116) to Arnold Drive, then south along Arnold Drive (Hwy. 116 and 121) to its intersection with Sears Point Road (Hwy. 137), then continuing south following the west bank of Tolay Creek to its mouth on San Pablo Bay.

Tubbs Island-Tolay Creek Area: Unincorporated area bounded by a line starting at the intersection of State Highway 37 at the Sonoma-Solano County line, thence southerly around the perimeter of Tubbs Island to the intersection with Tolay Creek, thence northerly along Tolay Creek to its intersection with State Highway 37, thence easterly along the south boundary of said State Highway 37 to the point of beginning.

Cloverdale Zone

Surrounding Cloverdale: The unincorporated northeast corner of Sonoma County surrounding the City of Cloverdale serving residences and businesses inside a boundary line starting at the

northeast corner of Sec. 4, T11N, R11W, then south to the center of Lake Sonoma in Sec. 4, T10N, R11W, then southeasterly approximately 3 miles following the Lake Sonoma basin, then east, crossing Dutcher Creek Road just south of Knecht Road, crossing Highway 101 at Seghesio Road, to the intersection of Barr Ranch Road and Ridge Oaks Road, then northeasterly, crossing Geysers Road at its intersection with Geysers Resort Road, to the Sonoma/Lake County line at the northeast corner of Sec. 1, T11N, R9W, then continuing westerly along the County line back to the northeast corner of Sec. 4, T11N, R11W.

Lake Sonoma: Northwest, as defined by the territory lying within Sonoma County, beginning at a point on the northerly Sonoma County line at the northeast corner of Sec. 4, T11N, R11W, MDM, then southerly on a straight line to its intersection with the center of Lake Sonoma in Sec. 4, T10N, R11W, MDM, then southeasterly along the center of Lake Sonoma to its intersection with the Warm Springs Dam, thence southeasterly to the intersection of Rockpile Road and Stewarts Point-Skaggs Springs Road, thence southerly along Stewarts Point-Skaggs Springs Road to its intersection with R10&11W, MDM, thence southerly along said Range Line to the southeast corner of Sec. 12, T8N, R10&11W, MDM, then westerly to the southwest corner of Sec. 11, T8N, R11W, MDM, then northwesterly to the southwest corner of Sec. 6, T9N, R12W, MDM, then north to the southwest corner of Sec. 19, T10N, R12W, MDM, thence northwesterly to the Sonoma-Mendocino County line at Sec. 30, T11N, R13W, MDM, thence northerly and easterly along the Sonoma-Mendocino County line to the point of beginning.

Pacific Coast Zone

The northwest coastal area of Sonoma County serving Sea Ranch, Annapolis and other residences and businesses inside a boundary line starting at Highway 1 at the south boundary of Fort Ross State Historic Park, continuing north along the Pacific Coast to the Mendocino County line, then east along the County line to a point at Sec. 30, T11N, R13W, then southeasterly to the southwest corner of Sec. 19, T10N, R12W, then south to the southwest corner of Sec. 6, T9N, R12W, then southeast to Sec. 11, T8N, R11W, then westerly to the Pacific Coast, just south of Fort Ross State Historic Park, including the western four miles of Fort Ross Road.

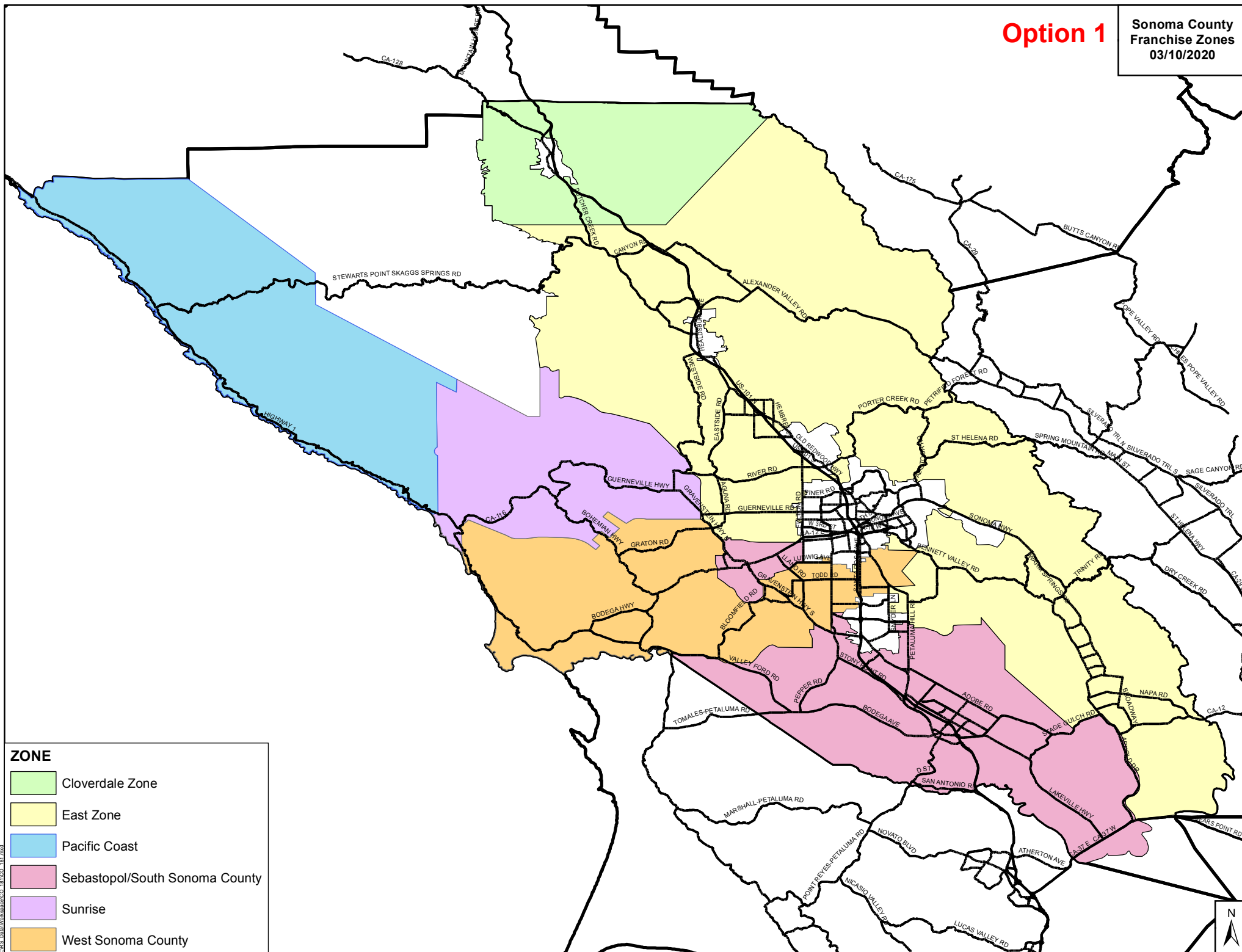
Sunrise Zone

The Russian River and central coastal area of Sonoma County serving residences and businesses inside a boundary line starting at Highway 1 at its intersection with Willow Creek Road (south side of Russian River), then north along the Pacific Coast to south boundary of Fort Ross State Historic Park, then easterly to the intersection of Meyers Grade Road; then generally easterly encompassing Russian River communities, including Duncan Mills, Monte Rio, Guerneville, Rio Nido, and Mirabel Heights to the Wohler Bridge at Westside Road then southerly encompassing Forestville, to Guerneville Road, just west of (not including) Vine Hill Road, then south along Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116) to Green Valley Road, then west along Green Valley Road to its intersection with Harrison Grade Road, then westerly, crossing Bohemian Highway north of Camp Meeker, and continuing back to the Pacific Coast at the mouth of the Russian River.

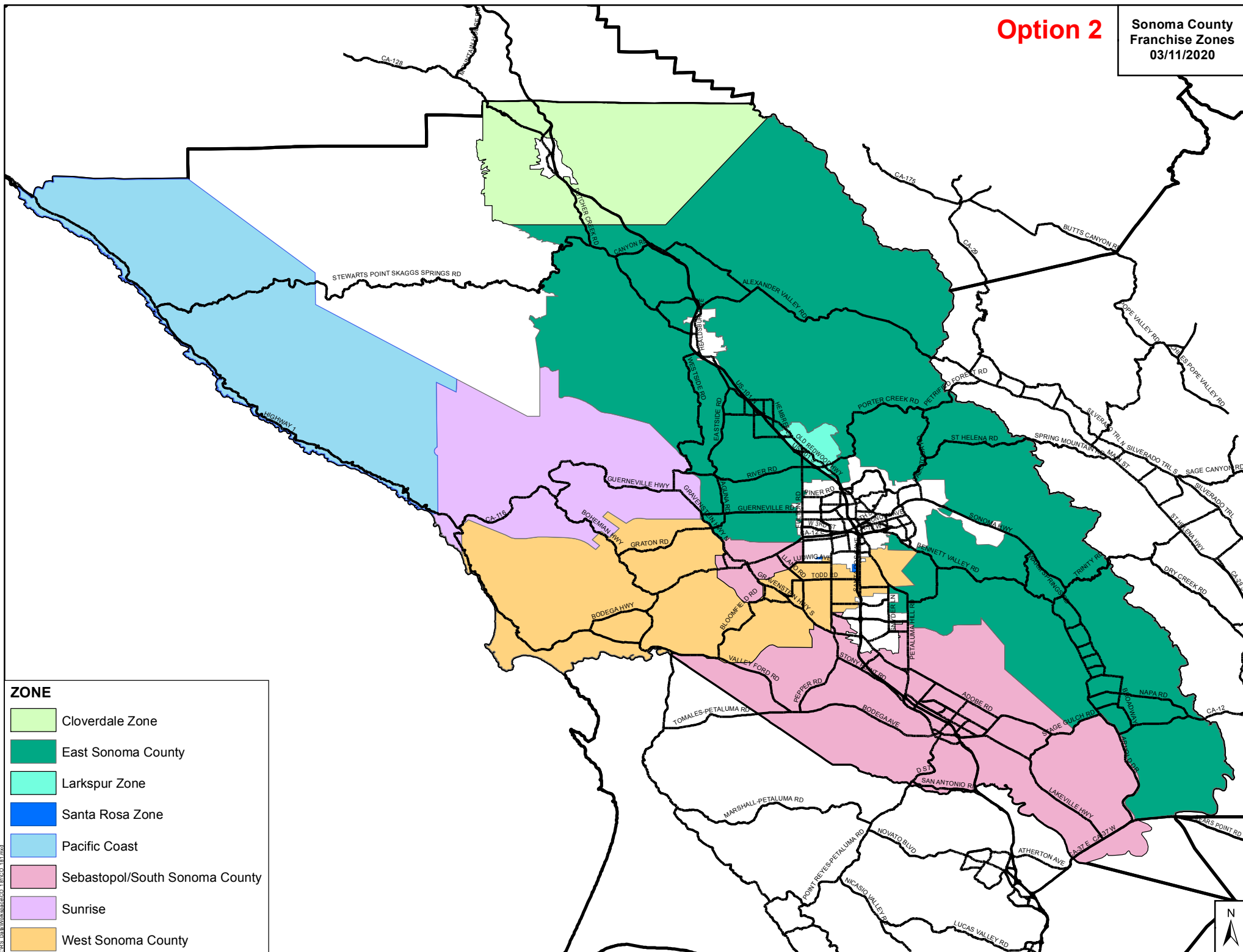
West Sonoma County Zone

Southwest coastal area of Sonoma County serving residences and businesses inside a boundary line starting at Highway 1 at its intersection with Valley Ford Road, north along the Pacific Coast to Willow Creek Road, then easterly inclusive of Willow Creek Road, Camp Meeker, Stoetz Lane, and Harrison Grade Road to its intersection with Green Valley Road, then east on Green Valley Road to Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116), then south on Gravenstein Hwy. to Mill Station Road, then west on Mill Station Road approximately 1/2 mile, then south to the intersection of Bodega Highway with Watertrough Road, south along Water Trough Road onto Pleasant Hill Road, then east and continuing north on Bloomfield Road to Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116), then north on Gravenstein Hwy. to Cooper Road, then east on Cooper Road to its end, then continuing easterly to Llano Road at its intersection with Ludwig Avenue, continuing east on Ludwig Ave. to Wright Road, then easterly following the southern city limits of Santa Rosa to Petaluma Hill Road, then south along Petaluma Hill Road (serving both sides of the road) to Snyder Lane, south on Snyder Lane to the city limits of Rohnert Park then westerly along the northern city limits of Rohnert Park to Wilfred Avenue, then west on Wilfred Ave. to Stony Point Road, then south on Stony Point Road to Gravenstein Highway (Hwy. 116), then northwest on Gravenstein Highway to Hessel Road to Blank Road, then south on Blank Road to Peterson Road, then south on Peterson Road to Roblar Road, then west on Roblar Road to Valley Ford Road, then west on Valley Ford Road to Highway 1.

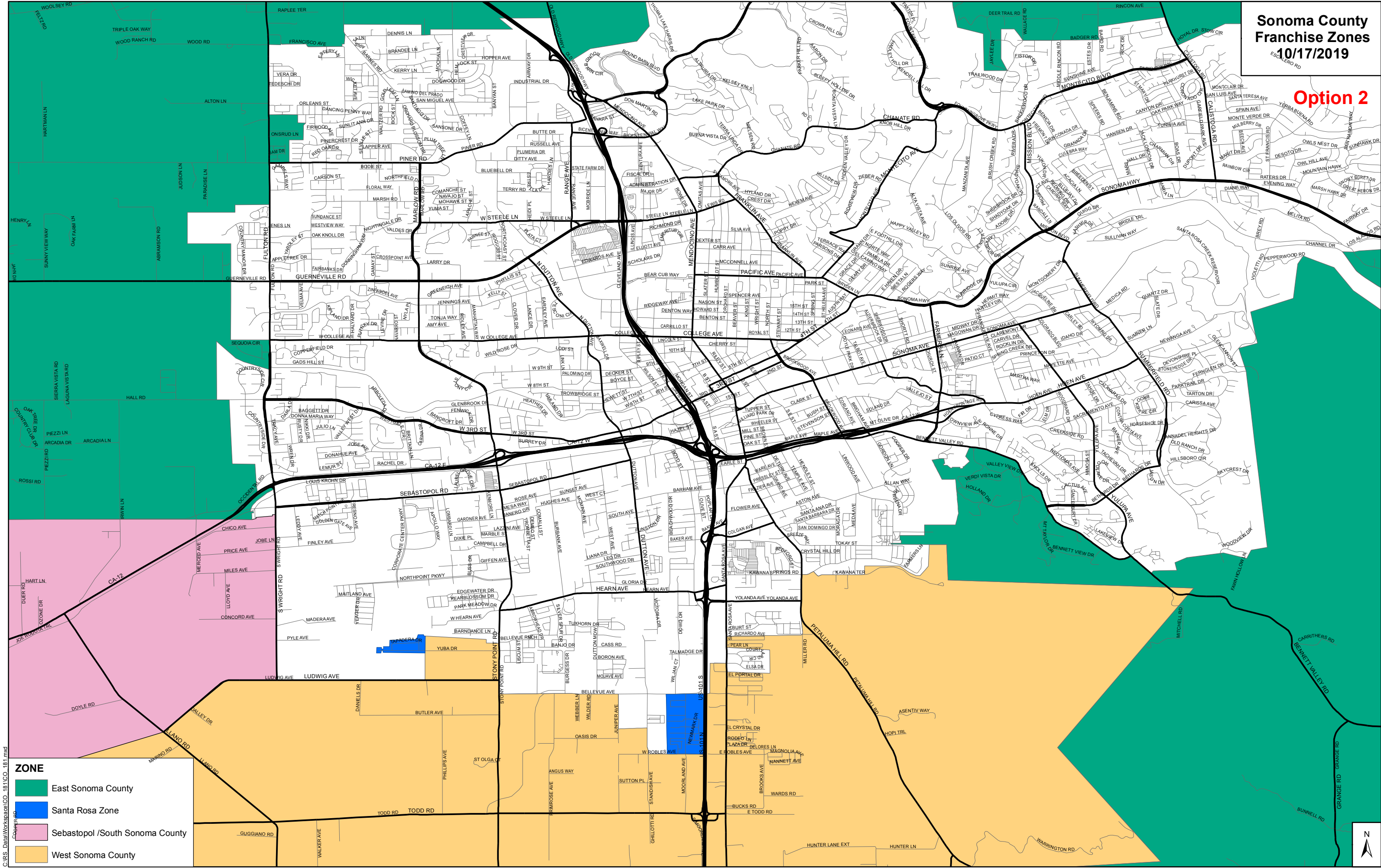
