





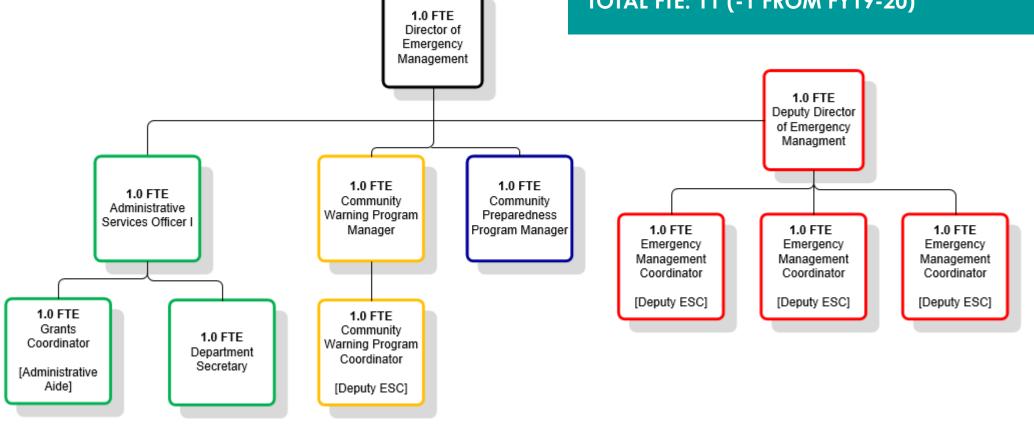
# **Department Overview Emergency Management**

FY 2020-21 RECOMMENDED + SUPP: \$2,342,781

## State and Federal Impacts to FY 2020-21 Budget



- In response to power shutoffs, the state is funding a second round of Community Power Resiliency grants. This will be administered by DEM.
- SB160 (now CA GC 8593.3.5) requires the County to conduct community engagement and integrate "cultural competence" considerations into any new emergency plan.
- The new federal Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) grant could provide significant funding for County hazard mitigation projects. Pending state guidance, this may be administered by DEM.
- Potential increase in competitive federal grant opportunities for disaster equipment, planning, training, and exercises due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Summary of Proposed Adjustments Aligning to Reduced Estimated Sources

Eliminate Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Operations & Maintenance Budget	-\$50,000
Eliminate funding for Emergency Management Consulting Services and Post-incident Reviews	-\$100,000
Reduce Services and Supplies	-\$24,280
Eliminate Emergency Coordination Operating Budget	-\$30,000
Reduce Community Alert and Warning Operating Budget	-\$30,000
Total Reduction:	-\$234,270



### Summary of Impacts of Proposed Adjustments



- Elimination of the EOC operations budget may reduce the readiness of some EOC systems and equipment.
- Elimination of the Emergency Management consulting services budget will prevent the County from contracting for support in developing emergency response plans or post-incident performance assessments.
- Elimination of the Emergency Coordination operations budget will reduce equipment and supplies that support emergency response.
- Reduction of the Alert and Warning operations budget will not allow for testing of new technologies and/or a reduction in related equipment.
  Alert & Warning activation costs will need to be charged to an incident.
