Project Site Intersection of Dry Creek Road and Yoakim Bridge Road




Project Structure


- 41.45-acre parcel; 90% of which is planted in vineyard

- ±14,040 sq. ft. winery structure, 75% dedicated to wine making
- All structures combined result in less than 0.60 acre or 1.4% lot coverage

Site Plan




