Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Sonoma, State of California, and the Board of Commissioners of the Sonoma County Community Development Commission Approving the Proposed FY 2020-21 Amended One Year Action Plan, Including the Authority to Award \$6,598,916 in ESG Funds Through Notices of Funding Availability or Requests for Proposals to Solicit Projects and Programs That Meet the Intent and Purpose Set Forth by HUD for This Funding and Abides by the Funding Policies of the Community Development Commission

Whereas, as a condition of receiving housing and community development funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Board approved the 2020 Consolidated Plan on June 2, 2020 which describes the community development priorities for the County;

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners approved the One Year Action Plan for FY 2020-2021 on June 2, 2020 that provides community development funding to be invested in activities that directly support the adopted priorities in the 2020 Consolidated Plan;

Whereas, the Federal Government passed the *Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act* (CARES Act) in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, which was declared a national emergency by President Trump on March 13, 2020; and

Whereas, through the CARES Act, the Department of Housing and Urban Development has made available an additional \$6,598,916 in supplemental Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding to the County of Sonoma for the benefit of unsheltered homeless, sheltered homeless, and those at risk of homelessness.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved he Board of Supervisors of the County of Sonoma and Board of Commissioners of the Sonoma County Community Development Commission approve the proposed FY 2020-21 Amended One Year Action Plan, including the authority to award \$6,598,916 in ESG funds through Notices of Funding Availability or Requests for Proposals to solicit projects and programs that meet the intent and purpose set forth by HUD for this funding and abides by the funding policies of the Community Development Commission.
