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Director

Measure P - Evelyn Cheatham Effective IOLERO Ordinance No. 6333

• Passed by approx. 65% vote (Nov. 2020)

• Effective December 8, 2020

Budget Increase

• The annual budget of IOLERO shall be set at a minimum of 1% of the total annual budget of the Sheriff's Office. This amount is a minimum, not a maximum. (Sec. 2-395)

Operational Agreement

• IOLERO and the Sheriff's Office shall agree on "written protocols that further define and specify the scope and process...[related to the] audit of complaints and investigations." (Sec. 2-394(d))

IOLERO's First Independent Investigation

• 110 protesters arrested in Santa Rosa on June 2-3, 2020

• The complaints against the Sheriff's Office related to the treatment of the protesters when they were at the Sonoma County Jail being booked and released.

• IOLERO contracted with an independent investigator in January to independently investigate the complaints and this work is underway.

Posting of Body Worn Camera Videos (BWC's)

• The public has an interest in how its Sheriff's Office is using force

Victims and defendants may have legally mandated privacy interests

• Law enforcement agencies, the district attorney's office and courts may have an interest in temporarily delaying publication of BWC's if an investigation or court case is pending.

Whistleblower Program

• Provides a safe port of call for employees of the Sheriff's Office who wish to report a violation of law, internal policy or otherwise problematic behavior occurring within the Sheriff's Office or by a fellow Sheriff's Office employee

Two New Attorneys

• Two new attorney positions were approved in September 2020

• These attorneys will assist with the backlog, handle current audits, conduct investigations and issue subpoenas.

Changes to the Director Position

• Director can be removed only for cause and upon a 4/5 vote

• Director shall be an attorney licensed to practice law in any state (previously the requirement was licensed in CA)

• Director shall be qualified as a certified practitioner of oversight by NACOLE at the time of employment or within a reasonable amount of time after hiring

The Community Advisory Council (CAC)

• CAC and IOLERO are now independent bodies

Qualifications for CAC membership have changed

• Split appointment authority between the Board of Supervisors and the IOLERO director.

Appointment of CAC Members

• Each supervisor shall appoint two members to the CAC, with the IOLERO director appointing one member.

• All applications and information that were in IOLERO's possession have been forwarded to your board.

• The Board should make CAC appointments utilizing the normal County staff recommendation process for appointments to commissions

Qualifications for CAC Members.

- Have not been employed by a LE agency for three years prior to appt.
- Demonstrated history of involvement in and engagement with:
 - 1. Serving/empowering disadvantaged communities
 - 2. Protecting/defending constitutional rights of individuals
 - 3. Issues concerning the effectiveness of fairness of the criminal justice system
 - 4. Serving or empowering members of communities that experience behavior or mental health challenges
 - 5. Spiritual, faith or religious institutions
- Demonstrated ability to engage in objective decision making, commitment to transparency, support for civilian oversight and residency in SoCo.

Measure P did not change:

- 1. IOLERO's policy and training recommendations are still *recommendations*.
- 2. IOLERO cannot change the decisions made by the Sheriff's Office.
- 3. IOLERO cannot decide policies or training or the Sheriff's Office.
- 4. IOLERO cannot discipline a sheriff employee or discuss discipline decisions with the public.
- 5. IOLERO cannot interfere with the constitutionally mandated duties and performance of the Sheriff's Office
