Introduction: Why a Consolidated Fee Hearing

- Fees items were posted on February 26, 2021 and hearing noticed on March 9 and 16
- Fee hearing takes place in spring so that adjustments can be included in revenue projections for the new year
- Fee hearings consolidated for transparency

Introduction: Why a Consolidated Fee Hearing

- Revenue Management Board Policy was ratified on 9/11/2020
 - "...fees and charges should cover all costs of the services provided, unless otherwise directed by the Board of Supervisors, to provide for the public benefit."

Introduction: What is not Included

- Fee studies for Permit Sonoma, Agriculture/Weights & Measures and Animal Services are ongoing
- No update to these fees at this time
- No changes to development impact fees
- No updates to Health Fees

Introduction: Why fees are changing

- Proposed changes reflect:
 - Increases in cost of doing business
 - Changes to service delivery
 - Updated cost studies
 - Statutory increases

Overview of Fee Changes: Cost of doing business

Two main factors:

- Countywide Operating Cost Changes
 - Main driver is Salary and Benefits
 - Average S&B expected to rise by 3.5% in FY 2021-22
 - Some variation in departments
- Goods and Services
 - Consumer Price Index for San Francisco Bay
 Area 2%



Overview of Fee Changes:

Overall 117 Fee items are changing

- 95 increasing
- 4 decreasing
- 13 eliminated
- 5 new fees
- All changes effective 7/1/2021



Transportation and Public Works - Airport	4	0	0	1	5

Overview of Fee Changes:

Most increases in line with salary and benefit increases

Overview of Fee Changes

Estimated Revenue Increase in FY 2021-22

Department	Total
County Administrator's Office	\$ 5,340
Regional Parks	\$ 90,869
Sheriff's Office	\$ 27,714
Transportation and Public Works - Airport	\$ 3,100
Total	\$ 127,023

Jail Booking Fees/Jail Access Fees (CAO): Total change: \$5,340

- Jail Booking Fees charged to arresting agencies for booking of inmates only if the state does not allocate funding
 - Not expected to be charged in FY 2021-22
- Jail Access Fee charged to arresting agencies for certain misdemeanor arrests in excess of average
 - Rate has not been adjusted since 2013, going up 8.8%

Regional Parks:

Total change: \$90,869

- Camping fees increasing by \$2 to \$3 dollars, in line with State Parks
 - First increase since 2015
- New \$2 County Resident discount for Parks Programs
- Streamlining of rates at Marinas including deletion of duplicate rates and adjustment of various fees
- New fee for retail fish sales from the boat

Sheriff's Office:

Total change: \$27,714

- Adjustments to a variety of fees based on changes to cost and new time studies
- Largest adjustments associated with review of work associated with Telecommunications rates and new Concealed Carry permits

Transportation and Public Works - Airport: Total change: \$3,100

- Adjustments to Vehicle Parking Fees
- New fee for Reserved Parking
- Fees in alignment with study put together pre-COVID, implementation delayed one year

A Look Forward:

 Health will return with details of plan for fee-relief of COVID-impacted business

 Due to delay of fee study, one-time support for Agriculture/Weights and Measures, Animal Servies, and Permit Sonoma proposed for FY 2021-22

FY 2019-20 Fee Hearings Recommended Actions

- Adopt a resolution setting the contingent Criminal Justice Administrative Fee (Jail Booking Fee) and the Jail Access Fee
- Adopt resolutions adjusting fees and adding and deleting fees for Regional Parks, Spring Lake Park, and the Regional Parks Marinas

FY 2019-20 Fee Hearings Recommended Actions (Continued)

- Adopt an ordinance establishing fees to be collected by the Sheriff-Coroner's Office
- Adopt a Resolution establishing rates and charges for the use of land and facilities at the Charles M.
 Schulz – Sonoma County Airport
