


# Ambulance Exclusive Operating Areas


- Health and Safety Code 1797.224 & Sonoma County EMS Ordinance

# EMS Ad Hoc Policy Direction & Stakeholder Input

- EndPoint received input from multiple organizations including periodic checkins with the EMS Ad Hoc committee.
  - EMS Ad Hoc Policy Direction
  - Met with City Managers
  - On-line survey
  - Video Conferencing
- Information received is the foundation for the ambulance RFP.





## RFP Highlights

- 1. Contract for exclusive market rights for 9-1-1 emergency ALS ambulance transport services (5 years with an additional 5 years based on performance)
- 2. Evaluation process follows EMS Ordinance
- 3. Most advantageous and the best value to the County
- 4. EOA includes Occidental, Healdsburg, Windsor, Geyserville, Alexander Valley and Knights Valley communities
- 5. Maintains open market for Critical Care & IFT ambulance transports
- 6. Allows for future development of a Behavioral Health program utilizing contractor paramedics
- 7. Provides additional evaluation points for advanced clinical and all risk training for ambulance staff





#### Qualifications

- Five years providing 9-1-1 ALS transport services similar the size and geographic nature of Sonoma County
  - Proposer may demonstrate capability in lieu of this experience.
- Proven strong financial history with the ability to finance a high-performance EMS system from startup.
- 3. Provide 5 years audited financial statements
  - Public entity must provide year-end financial statements for the last three years.
- 4. Documentation of ability to meet minimum response times standards.
  - Public Proposer must submit documentation demonstrating it has the knowledge and expertise to comply with mandated response times.
- 5. Documented proof of availability to measure and achieve compliance with Clinical Performance Standards.
- 6. Excellent references and performance in of integrated EMS systems

# Provisions in RFP

- Allows subcontracting for ALS ambulance transport services
- Standard Insurance minimums with allowance for public providers self insurance programs
- Performance guarantee of 6 months operating expenses, ability to waive this requirement for public providers



## Scope of Work



- Maintains current response time standards
- Programs to monitor and analyze patient care data
- Reimburse the County for County's expenses
  - Oversight, monitoring and managing the Agreement and for Medical Direction.
- Enhanced Clinical Performance Standards.
- Continues City of Santa Rosa for First Response ALS (FRALS) services.
- No cost restock to fire departments for medical supplies used on a patient.

- Requires Ambulance surge during peak periods or unexpected periods of unusually high call volume including disasters.
- Ambulances must be configured to meet the safety and ergonomic needs of employees.
- Power lift gurneys with additional bariatric capability for patients up to 1,000 lbs.
- Proposer encouraged to preferentially hire the incumbent paramedic and EMT workforce.
- Monitors the use of Mutual Aid



# Financial Reporting



Contractor to provide quarterly system reports to include revenue and system expenses and year-end audited financial reports.



Provide Financial Hardship Policy for patients without medical insurance and who have limited financial capacity.

#### **EOA Expansion Recommendations**

Expand the EOA to include the Occidental area formerly supported by Falck and the northern area serviced by Bells

- Creates consistent service delivery between these areas and has the largest economy
  of scale effect
- 2. Ensures the area is under a performance-based contract that does not rely upon separate non-public negotiations

Alternatively, the Board can direct staff to create a second EOA that grants exclusivity that is lost upon sale or provide additional direction regarding terms



#### **Recommended Actions**

- A) Approve the expansion of the Exclusive Operating Area to incorporate the West County community of Occidental and adjacent areas formerly supported by Falck Ambulance and the Northern County areas currently support by Bell's Ambulance Services (Bells).
- B) Approve the RFP for submission to California Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA).
