#### SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES

This Second Amendment ("Second Amendment"), dated as of June 8, 2021, is by and between the County of Sonoma, a political subdivision of the State of California ("County"), and North Bay Fire, Inc., a non-profit public benefit corporation (hereinafter "NBF"), collectively referred to herein as the "Parties" who agree as follows.

# <u>RECITALS</u>

WHEREAS, County desires to promote maximum utilization of fire and emergency service resources within Sonoma County; and

WHEREAS, NBF is a Non-Profit Public Benefit Corporation organized pursuant to the laws of the State of California, presently in good standing with the California Secretary of State. The Articles of NBF authorize NBF to perform fire and emergency services, and are consistent with the terms and conditions of this agreement; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2019, the County entered into the Agreement for Fire Protection Services ("Agreement") with NBF for the performance of primary fire and emergency services within the boundaries of County Fire Service Area No. 40 ("CSA 40"); and

WHEREAS, on November 19, 2019, the Board of Supervisors authorized the County Administrator to enter into the First Amendment to Agreement for Fire Protection Services ("First Amendment"). The First Amendment added the administration of programming for the Mayacamas and Wilmar Community Facilities Districts to the scope of work of the Agreement for an additional not to exceed amount of \$132,900; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Board of Supervisors, it is necessary and desirable to continue to employ the services of NBF to provide support services to the CSA 40.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

### AGREEMENT

I. Section 2 of the Agreement, entitled "<u>Scope of Services</u>" shall be amended to add Section 2.7 <u>Unspent Funds Expenditure Plan</u> to include the following provision:

Any unspent funds remaining at the end of a fiscal year (July 1-June 30) shall only be spent as outlined in Exhibit E.

II. Section 3 of the Agreement, entitled "<u>Compensation</u>" is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows:

3.1. For and in consideration of the rendition of fire and emergency services hereunder, County shall pay NBF compensation of \$2,200,000 to be paid biannually on July 15 and January 15. A breakdown of costs used to derive the lump sum amount is specified in Exhibit C, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. 3.2. For all services and incidental costs authorized by Section 2.6, NBF shall receive \$115,000 to be paid bi-annually on July 15 and January 15 for the Wilmar Community Facility District.

3.3 In the event a countywide sales tax measure to fund fire services passes, or if any portion of CSA 40 consolidates with, or is annexed into, another entity, the parties agree to renegotiate the terms of this Agreement.

- III. Section 4 of the Agreement, entitled "<u>Term of Agreement</u>" shall be amended from April 1, 2019 to June 30, 2023.
- IV. Exhibit B of the Agreement, entitled "Scope of Work" is amended as follows:
  - a. Paragraph 5 of Exhibit B is hereby deleted in its entirety and is replaced with the following:
    - "5. NBF shall provide quarterly reports to the County Administrator's Office or the County Fleet Manager as provided below:
      - 5.1. To the County Administrator's Office, attention Principal Analyst: All training provided to the volunteer firefighters of CSA 40, including the name of firefighter, type and content of training, who performed the training and their qualifications to perform the training, and any and all certifications received by these volunteers during the training; and
      - 5.2. To the County Fleet Manager: All maintenance performed on equipment owned by either a volunteer fire company or the County of Sonoma, including reports from the garage or mechanic that performed the maintenance on any vehicles owned by either a volunteer fire company or the County of Sonoma."
  - b. Paragraph 14 of Exhibit B is hereby deleted in its entirety and is replaced with the following:
    - "14. Reports.
      - 14.1. NBF shall complete and submit incident reports of all events within County Fire Service Area #40 to the State. NBF shall complete incident reports of all events it responds to within fourteen (14) days of the incident and shall submit the incident reports quarterly to the State, and shall submit a copy of the reports to the County Administrator's office, attention Principal Analyst. NBF shall submit the required

annual reports to the State on behalf of the County, and shall submit a copy of the annual report to the County Administrator's office, attention Principal Analyst.

- 14.2. NBF shall be required to complete the NFPA National Fire Experience Survey annually, and provide a copy to the County Administrator's office, attention Principal Analyst."
- V. Exhibit C of the Agreement, entitled "<u>Cost Breakdown</u>" is hereby deleted and is replaced with Attachment A attached to this Second Amendment.
- VI. Exhibit D1 of the Agreement, entitled "<u>NBF Assigned Vehicles</u>" is hereby deleted and is replaced with Attachment B attached to this Second Amendment.
- VI. Exhibit E of the Agreement, entitled "<u>Unspent Funds Expenditure Plan</u>", attached to this Second Amendment as Attachment C, is hereby added to the Agreement.
- VII. Except to the extent the Agreement is specifically amended or supplemented hereby, together with exhibits and schedules is, and shall continue to be, in full force and effect as originally executed, and nothing contained herein shall be construed to modify, invalidate or otherwise affect any provision of the Agreement or any right of County arising there under.

NBF warrants the person affixing his or her signature hereto is authorized to execute this agreement on behalf of Recipient.

COUNTY AND NBF HAVE CAREFULLY READ AND REVIEWED THIS SSCOND AMENDMENT AND EACH TERM AND PROVISION CONTAINED HEREIN AND, BY EXEUTION OF THIS AMENMENT, SHOW THEIR INFORMED AND VOLUNTARY CONSENT THERETO.

#### Exhibit E

### Unspent Funds Expenditure Plan

- A. Over the two-year term of this agreement, the County of Sonoma and North Bay Fire (NBF) agree that NBF may spend any accumulated contract funds on the following to support volunteer fire fighting readiness.
  - a. Strike Team revenue to be spent on capital improvements to facilities being used by NBF to perform the fire and emergency services pursuant to this Agreement, including installation of exhaust fans, building improvements, and major repairs to infrastructure.
  - b. Purchase of new Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA).
  - c. Purchase of mobile and hand held radios.
  - d. Purchase of Personnel Protective Equipment (PPE).
- B. NBF and the County agree that unspent funds may also be used to purchase fire apparatus, which would require approval by the Board of Supervisors and the return of unspent funds to the County to facilitate the purchase.
