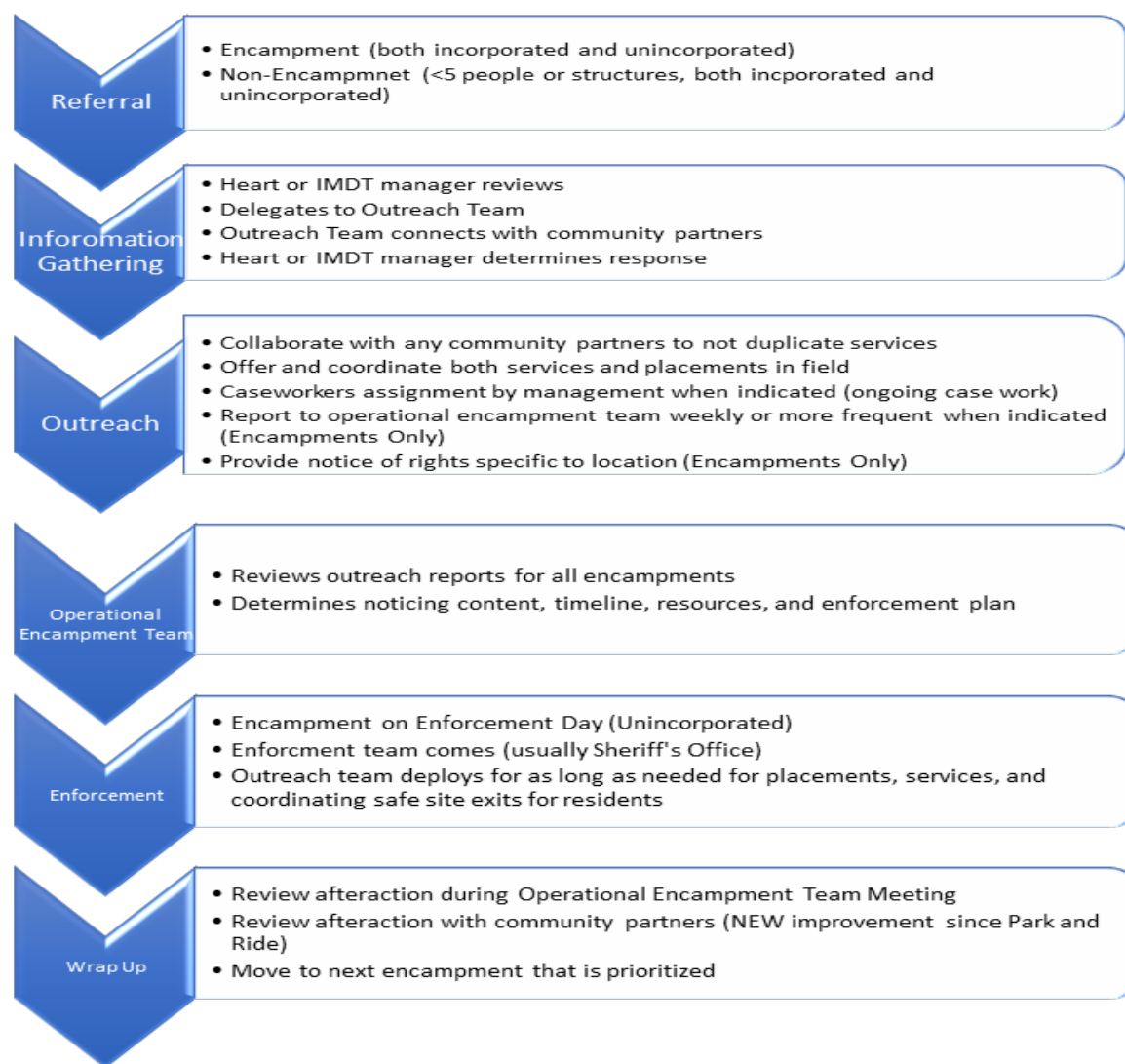

Homeless Encampment Access & Resource Team (HEART)

Focuses on sheltering Sonoma County's homeless population. This cohort was established to respond to the Joe Rodota Trail encampment, the largest in the County's history. It was expanded in March of 2020 to outreach and provide coordinated care to individuals living in encampments in the unincorporated parts of the county and the cities of Sebastopol, Cotati, Rohnert Park, Sonoma, Healdsburg, Cloverdale, Windsor, and the Town of Windsor as well as collaborating with CBOs in Santa Rosa and Petaluma. The cohort provides integrated care management services to individuals with higher needs through IMDT (the Interdepartmental Multi-Disciplinary Team)

From Outreach to Housed - Summary Encampment Engagement



HEART (Homeless Encampment Access and Resource Team) -

Street outreach and coordinated care to individuals/families address encampments in:

- The unincorporated area
- The cities of Cloverdale, Cotati, Healdsburg, Rohnert Park, Sebastopol, Sonoma, and the Town of Windsor
- CBO-based outreach in those cities plus Santa Rosa and Petaluma
- Care through other ACCESS cohorts (Mental Health diversion, high needs homeless, ER high utilizers, COVID-19).

HEART coordinates care to individuals from encampments to:

- Treatment facilities
- Shelters (congregate & non-congregate)
- Transitional Housing
- Permanent supportive Housing
- Individuals are connected services/supports such as medical; Cal-fresh; workforce development; legal services, etc.
