## Resolution Of The Board Of Supervisors Of The County Of Sonoma, State Of California,

**Whereas,** an estimated 40,000 residents in the County of Sonoma ("County") are undocumented immigrants of diverse racial, ethnic and national backgrounds, with varied cultures, religions, orientations, abilities and viewpoints; and

**Whereas,** the County recognizes that the diversity of backgrounds, perspectives, and experiences of undocumented immigrants contribute to the cultural richness and economic wellness of our nation and communities, and

**Whereas,** the legal status of undocumented immigrants currently restricts many aspects of their lives, including employment options and access to certain safety net programs, and

**Whereas,** the County believes that all of its residents should have the right to pursue a dignified life with meaningful employment opportunities and access to community safety nets including disaster relief aid, and

Whereas, existing immigration law does not provide clear pathways to citizenship for most undocumented immigrants in this county, which results in hardships including but not limited to barriers in securing safe and dignified housing and employment, increased vulnerability during times of disaster, lack of access to healthcare, and the constant threat of deportation and family separation.

**Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved** that the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors urges
