
Project Highlights

 in burned areas = 29%
- Prescribed fire & grazing = 9%

- Average: \$184,340










CAVEDALE & TRINITY ROADSIDE TREATMENT 10.3 miles + Critical Asset Protection

Local Funding:

Potential Fire Tax Measure

State Funding:

- FY 21/22 & FY 22/23 = \$1.514 Billion for Forest Health & Fire Prevention
- Resilient Forest & Landscape = \$608 Million (CALFIRE)
- Community Hardening = \$25 Million (CalOES & CALFIRE)
- Cal VTP & LiDAR data = \$48 Million (CALFIRE & Natural Res. Agency)

Federal Funding:

- Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) FEMA
- Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) FEMA
