What is CalAIM?

► California Advancing & Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) is a multi-year DHCS initiative to improve the quality of life & health outcomes of our population by implementing broach delivery system, program & payment reform across the Medi-Cal program.

Near Term Impacts to DHS

- January 2022
 - ► Enhanced Care Management & Community Supports (Formerly In-Lieu of Services ILOS)
 - Whole Person Care (WPC) ends. DHS will incorporate ECM & Community Supports, via contracts with Partnership HealthPlan of California (PHC), to redesign WPC & continue to serve individuals, who have severe mental illness & are homeless.
 - ▶ Jan-July 2023 pilot period to determine sustainability
 - Changes to eligibility criteria Increased ability to provide MH services to individuals prior to diagnosis. (Improved services & funding)
 - ▶ DMC-ODS Sonoma County may have the opportunity to negotiate with DHCS to join the ODS waiver in 2022-2023
 - ▶ Peer Support Services DHCS will offer counties the opportunity to "opt-in" to provide & bill Peer Support Services to Medi-Cal.

CalAIM - Additional impacts

- ▶ July 2022
 - ▶ Documentation Redesign MH & SUD A step in process to reduce charting & administrative burdens
 - Co-Occurring Treatment Administrative relief when serving individuals with MH & SUD service needs
 - ▶ No Wrong Door Allow services from multiple delivery systems
- July 2023
 - ▶ Payment Reform
 - Sets fixed rates
 - Eliminates cost settlement process
 - Draws Federal Financial Participation (FFP) with Intergovernmental Transfer (IGT) process (eliminates Certified Public Expenditure process)
 - ▶ New cost reporting processes & reductions in audit/review processes
- Many more developments to come

CalAIM Decision Points

- Most CalAIM initiatives will result in requirements for Sonoma County to continue to contract with DHCS to be the Medi-Cal Mental Health Plan & Drug Medi-Cal Plan.
- Four known CalAIM initiatives are discretionary & will require Sonoma County to decide whether or not to opt-in.
 - November 2021 Enhanced Care Management (ECM) Provider
 - > Staff recommends that DHS enter into a contract to provide Enhanced Care Management services with PHC, for homeless individuals, who are Medi-Cal beneficiaries.
 - Staff recommends that DHS monitor & analyze the financial & programmatic functioning of the benefits, to determine whether or not DHS will continue as an ECM provider for PHC.
 - Early 2022 Community Support Services Provider
 - Staff will determine whether or not to offer a recommendation that DHS become a Community Support services (i.e. housing-related services) provider for PHC.
 - If Sonoma County determines it will provide Community Supports, staff will recommend that DHS monitor & analyze service provision to determine whether or not to continue to provide this service.
 - ► TBD 2022 Peer Support Services
 - ▶ Staff will review upcoming DHCS guidance re: "opting-in" to provide Peer Support Services, & offer recommendations to the BOS as appropriate.
 - ► TBD 2022 DMC-Organized Delivery System (ODS)
 - ▶ Staff will come to the BOS with a recommendation re: whether or not Sonoma County should apply to DHCS to be an ODS county.
