Disbursement of Fiscal Year 23-24 Second District Community Investment Grant Awards

Recommended Action:

Approve Community Investment Fund grant awards and Authorize the County Administrator, or designee, to execute an agreement with the following entities for a Community Investment Fund Grant for FY 23-24: Community Equity Foundation Inc., \$2,000; Entrepreneurs of Tomorrow, \$2,000; Free to Be, \$2,000; Los Cien Sonoma County, \$3,500; North Bay Performing Arts Association, \$1,500; Santa Rosa Symphony, \$2,000; Sonoma County Alano Club, \$2,000; Sonoma County Commission on the Status of Women (Sonoma County Human Resources Department), \$1,000; and Sonoma Family Meal, \$4,000. (Second District)

Executive Summary:

The Board established the Local Events, Organizations, and District Priorities category to fund local events that will support businesses, enhance culture, and organizations that provide a benefit to the community, or to award funding to County Departments to fulfill Supervisorial District priorities. Events and organizations may make requests throughout the year to one or more Supervisorial Districts.

The Second District has reviewed the applications and wishes to recommend the following FY 23-24 grant awards:

- 1) Community Equity Foundation Inc. for expenses related to 3rd Annual African Soul Festival, grant award of \$2,000;
- 2) Entrepreneurs of Tomorrow for expenses related to the 54th Annual MLK/Juneteenth Festival, grant award of \$2,000;
- 3) Free to Be for expenses related to the expansion of youth mental health support programs at

- Petaluma High School and Casa Grande High School, grant award of \$2,000;
- 4) Los Cien Sonoma County for expenses related to the 2024 Puente y Ganas Awards Dinner, grant award of \$3,500;
 - 5) North Bay Performing Arts Association for expenses related to the Spring performance, grant award of \$1,500;
 - 6) Santa Rosa Symphony for expenses related to the “It’s Elementary” music education program conducted at District Two schools, grant award of \$2,000;
 - 7) Sonoma County Alano Club for expenses related to the support of several recovery programs, grant award of \$2,000;
 - 8) Sonoma County Commission on the Status of Women (Sonoma County Human Resources Department) for expenses related to translation of “The Report on the Status of Women and Girls in Sonoma County”, grant award of \$1,000; and
 - 9) Sonoma Family Meal for expenses related to food distribution to low-income families at McDowell Elementary School, grant award of \$4,000.

Discussion:

Transient Occupancy Tax Funding

The Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) is levied at a rate of 12% in unincorporated Sonoma County, a rate established in 2016 by the voter-approved Measure L. The first 9% of the TOT rate is allocated 33% to the General Fund and 67% to the Community Investment special revenue fund; and the last 3% includes Measure L funds.

Community Investment Fund Program and Policy

The Sonoma County Community Investment Fund grant program utilizes a portion of the Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) to encourage economic development, community engagement, enhance culture through a variety of grant award and funding avenues. The program provides various grants to community non-profits for advertising and economic development, events, and the county as a visitor destination with the goal of advancing economic growth through tourism. Additionally, the program provides grants to address impacts on safety due to tourism and to enhance community services throughout the county. The program provides funding to the Regional Parks Department, the Economic Development Department, and a number of other county department activities. Community Investment Funds are allocated per the Community Investment Fund Policy (<https://sonomacounty.ca.gov/administrative-support-and-fiscal-services/county-administrators-office/community-investment-fund-program/community-investment-program-policy>).

Local Events, Organizations, and District Priorities Category

The Board established the Local Events, Organizations, and District Priorities category to fund local events that will support businesses, enhance culture, and organizations that provide a benefit to the community, or to award funding to County Departments to fulfill Supervisorial District priorities. Funding for these events and organizations is provided at the discretion of each Supervisorial District, with an allocation of \$100,000 for each district. Events and organizations may make requests throughout the year to one or more Supervisorial Districts.

Funds will be distributed upon approval of these awards by the Board of Supervisors and execution of the

Community Investment Fund grant agreement by the entity. The agreements will be executed by the County Administrator, or designee. The agreements require the County seal on promotional materials produced using the grant award.
