Title:

Amendment to Contract with Stantec Consulting Services for work related to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Brownfields Grant Award

Recommended Action:

Authorize the Executive Director of the Sonoma County Community Development Commission (Commission) or designee to execute a third amendment increasing the contract with Stantec Consulting for environmental services by \$40,000 for an amount not to exceed \$359,000; and extending the term from December 31, 2019 to December 31, 2020.

(Fifth District)

Executive Summary:

Approval of this item will increase the contract's not to exceed amount from \$319,000 to \$359,000, which still fits within the total grant awarded to the Commission and approved by the Board of Commissioners on August 30, 2016. This amendment will also lengthen the term of the contract by one year, and reflect Commission and EPA approved modifications to the Scope of Work. The EPA, the Commission, and the Consultant agreed that the best use of remaining grant funds is to complete Phase II environmental reports, and to adjust the scope of work accordingly. Those reports will identify and potentially relieve significant obstacles faced by prospective developers. To complete the Phase II reports, the EPA granted the Commission a one-year grant extension and left the total award of \$392,000 unchanged.

Discussion:

The presence of environmental contamination on many private and public properties in Roseland has been a

critical barrier to attracting investors and developers to the underserved Roseland community. Roseland is disproportionally affected by the presence of environmental contaminants resulting in negative impacts on the neighborhood's business community, residents, and potential neighborhood investment. Redevelopment has long been a focus of the County and the City of Santa Rosa and conforms to the Sebastopol Road Urban Vision Plan (UVP).

To help address the environmental contamination, the Commission applied for and was awarded a grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency for \$392.000. An RFP for consulting services was issued and resulted in an agreement with Stantec Consulting, which was approved by the Board of Commissioners on February 21, 2017. As described in the Scope of Work, Stantec Consulting began engaging the community and other stakeholders to help identify sites eligible for clean-up. That outreach resulted in the selection of several abandoned and vacant properties. Working with the Commission, EPA, and the abandoned and vacant property owners, and as further described in the Scope of Work, Stantec completed Phase I environmental reporting. The Commission and consultant continued engaging the community as well as potential investors interested in developing multi-unit housing. Based on that input, the EPA, the Commission, and the Consultant agreed that the best use of remaining grant funds is to complete Phase II environmental reports, and to adjust the scope of work accordingly. Those reports will identify and potentially relieve significant obstacles faced by developers. To complete the Phase II reports, the EPA granted the Commission a one-year grant extension and left the total award of \$392,000 unchanged. Subsequently, the Commission is requesting that the Board of Commissioners approve the extension of the Consultant's existing contract for one-year and increase the not to exceed by \$40,000 total to accommodate these adjustments to the Scope of Work.

- August 30, 2016 the Board of Commissioners approved the Commission's receipt of a United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Brownfields Grant for \$392,000
- **February 21, 2017** CDC released an RFP on September 19, 2016 for environmental consulting work; Board of Commissioners approved the resulting contract with Stantec Consulting
