Disbursement of Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Third District Community Investment Fund Grant Awards

Recommended Action:

Approve Community Investment Fund grant awards and authorize the County Administrator, or designee, to execute an agreement with the following entity for a Community Investment Grant for FY 2019-2020: Mi Futuro (fiscal sponsor: Social Good Fund), \$3,000; The Center for Social and Environmental Stewardship, \$5,000; Sonoma County Fair & Sonoma County Harvest Fair, \$5,000; Nuestra Comunidad, \$1,000; Vietnam Veterans of California, Inc. dba Veterans Resource Centers of, \$3000; Santa Rosa Symphonic Chorus, \$1,000; Active 20-30 Santa Rosa #50, \$1,000; LITE Initiatives dba Community Bikes, \$1,000; Sonoma Food Runners (fiscal sponsor: Matter of Trust), \$2,000. (Third District) (Majority)

Executive Summary:

Local Events, Organizations, District Priorities Grants of the Community Investment Fund Policy provides grant allocations to each Supervisor, to be distributed at the Supervisor's discretion. The Third District has reviewed the applications and wishes to recommend the following FY 2019-2020 grant awards:

- 1. Mi Futuro (fiscal sponsor: Social Good Fund) for funding the Annual Youth Healthcare Symposium, school healthcare speakers, and 2020 Workshops; grant award of \$3,000;
- 2. The Center for Social and Environmental Stewardship for funding fire fuels management youth program; grant award of \$5,000;
- 3. Sonoma County Fair & Sonoma County Harvest Fair for advertisement and promotion of The Sonoma County Fair and The Sonoma County Harvest Fair; grant award of \$5,000;
- 4. Nuestra Comunidad to support the Vintage Zinfandel Senior Citizen Disaster Preparedness Project; grant award of \$1,000;
- 5. Vietnam Veterans of California, Inc. dba Veterans Resource Centers of America for maintenance and

- repairs of transitional housing for homeless veterans; grant award of \$3,000;
- 6. Santa Rosa Symphonic Chorus for advertising and promotion of the 2019-2020 Concert season; grant award of \$1,000;
- 7. Active 20-30 Santa Rosa #50 for marketing, promotion and a tour for the Active 20-30 US and International Midterm 2020 Event; grant award of \$1,000;
- 8. LITE Initiatives dba Community Bikes to support their bike refurbishing program expansion, grant award of \$1,000; and
- 9. Sonoma Food Runners (fiscal sponsor: Matter of Trust) for support and expansion of their program to prevent hunger and food waste in Sonoma County; grant award of \$2,000.

Discussion:

The Sonoma County Community Investment Fund grant program utilizes a portion of the Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) to encourage economic development, community engagement, enhance culture through a variety of grant award and funding avenues. The program provides various grants to community non-profits for advertising and economic development, events and the county as a visitor destination with the goal of advancing economic growth through tourism. Additionally, the program provides grants to address impacts on safety due to tourism and to enhance community services throughout the county. The program provides funding to the Regional Parks Department as well as the Economic Development Department and a number of other county department activities, all with the focus of supporting the community's recovery efforts.

The Community Investment Fund Policy is divided into different categories. The Board established the Local Events, Organizations, District Priorities category to fund local events that will support businesses, enhance culture, and organizations that provide a benefit to the community. The Board may award funding to County Department to fulfill Supervisorial District priorities. Funding for these events and organizations is provided at the discretion of each Supervisorial District based on an overall allocation of \$500,000 divided equally across each district. Events and organizations make requests throughout the year to the Supervisorial District in which their event/organization exists.

Funds will be distributed upon approval of these awards by the Board of Supervisors and execution of the Community Investment Fund grant agreement (contract) by the entity. The contracts will be executed by the County Administrator, or designee. The contracts will require the County seal on promotional materials produced using the grant award.

Activities performed utilizing Community Investment Program grants provide public benefits that serve important community needs under Government Code Section 26227.
